PBL - Positive Behaviour for Learning

Our school successfully implements the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL). PBL is an evidence-based framework that brings together the whole-school community to contribute to developing a positive, safe and supportive learning culture. The framework assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for our students. Through PBL, teachers and students have more time to focus on

relationships and classroom instruction. Students and staff benefit from:

- ✓ reduced inappropriate behaviour
- ✓ increased time focused on instruction
- ✓ improved social-emotional wellbeing
- ✓ positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- ✓ support for teachers to teach, model and respond effectively to student need
- ✓ a predictable learning environment where staff and students know what is expected to deliver effective practices that can be sustained over time

Our PBL focus is changed on a fortnightly basis or as needed depending on what is happening with student behaviour in the playground and classroom as well as upcoming school events.

Students are rewarded with a PBL day at the end of each term. This term we are having a Crazy Hair Day and PJ Day. The students really enjoy this day and we look forward to seeing creative and crazy hair and warm and woolly pyjamas.

PBL Reward Day

Crazy Hair Day and PJ Day will be held on Friday 4 July, the last day of term. Our PBL focus for the next fortnight is looking at the school value of Resilience.

In mathematics, we've been revising the concept of time, focusing especially on the 24-hour clock. These small, real-world connections go a long way in helping children see how important time is in our everyday lives.

their KROP dance I've also been able to teach kindergarten. I've included a few photos of these special moments.






Over the past fortnight, the students have been sharing their group research projects based on Blueback by Tim Winton, the novel we've been reading in class. Through this they've developed deeper unit, а appreciation for ocean conservation, learned new vocabulary, and explored how authors create setting, character, and theme. In response to the powerful quote, "The ocean is sick," students wrote pieces focusing on different environmental impacts and used the characters from the text, they've come to know. Their responses were so thoughtful and well-written that I contacted Tim Winton's literary agent - who has kindly passed the students' work on to him. Fingers crossed we hear back!

A few students also helped tidy up the cloakroom, sorting out the many jumpers and jackets that are often left behind during the afternoon rush to catch transport.
