#### **NAIDOC** Week

Although NAIDOC Week was celebrated around the country during Week 10 last term, here at Goolgowi Public School we are going to celebrate NAIDOC Week during Week 2. During the week students will participate in activities and lessons to build knowledge and understanding around Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and culture.

We also have very talented Aboriginal students from Griffith and Wade High School visit our school to work collaboratively with our students to design and create a series of murals that will be placed in the panels on the brick classroom building. On Friday we will participate in a range of activities to build cultural understanding including, artworks, making Johnny cakes and participating in a range of traditional Aboriginal games. The art work and theme for NAIDOC week is about the next generation: Strength, Vision and Legacy.

The NAIDOC week artwork was created and designed by Jeremy Morgan Worrall and is titled 'Ancestral Lines". The artist explains the artwork below.

'This artwork is a visual representation of the generational lines that carry through my mob. When I think of the next generation, I think towards my ancestors—Lucy Wright, Enoch Wright, Nonie Wright—through to my Nanna Audrie and my Mother Vanessa. Looking back gives me the strength and vision to look forward. Each figure in the painting is tied to family lines, like songlines, reflecting what they knew and what they passed on. The first represents lore, hunting, and tracking. The second reflects care, weaving, and love. The third shows the two combined, while the final two carry unfinished elements—symbols of knowledge and care in motion. Above them sits the essence of Country—swirling skies and a giant moon over Emmaville. It is by the fire, under these cool skies, where the next generation finds their strength, vision, and legacy.'


