

3-6 News

Term 3 is well underway, and our Stage 2 and 3 students are buzzing with excitement as they prepare for their upcoming KROP performance. I've had the privilege of watching a few of their rehearsals, and I must say, I'm both surprised and thoroughly impressed by how well they remember their choreography and work together as a team. Like many of you, I'm eagerly looking forward to seeing the final polished performance.

Amidst their regular rehearsals, we've continued with our classroom learning.

Thank you for your support with home reading. I am noticing greater confidence as students read with improving fluency and



prosody. It's encouraging to see the student's enjoyment of reading also developing.

Many students are excited as they improve their knowledge of multiplication facts and are learning to apply them in a variety of contexts.

I've included a few photos from our science focus last term, Our Material World. The students explored the role of people and technology in the mass-production of toys. They used their knowledge of properties of materials and designed and produced a toy. Students worked by themselves or with partners. Some very creative toys were designed and students enjoyed the creative process.







In the first part of this term, we've been exploring a hybrid text titled *Desert Lake*, which focuses on Lake Eyre. The students are learning about this fascinating lake and how it transforms with the seasons. We've also been studying the rich and descriptive language used by author Pamela Freeman. Inspired by her writing, students have been experimenting with adverbial clauses and phrases to enhance their own writing. Below are a few examples of their work.


