to Jess Burns for helping coach and running the team.






#### **Attendance**

#### Year 3-6 News



In the classroom, we've also been working hard in Mathematics. This week Stage 2 have been consolidating a range of strategies to efficiently add and subtract numbers, as well as learning to tell time to five-minute intervals on an analog clock. This can be a tricky concept, so any support you can give at home to reinforce their understanding would be very helpful. Stage 3 have been exploring how to partition numbers in non-standard ways. This helps build flexibility and efficiency when mentally calculating with large numbers.

I'll include a few snap shots of work we've been doing with magnets as part of our science unit. We explored how magnetic forces can exert pushes and pulls on objects without direct contact and investigated how magnets interact with different materials. The students enjoyed seeing the magnetic forces at work.
