Carly Hogan, a very kind teacher at Byron Bay Public School, quizzed everyone with what we had learnt. Even though it was a bit awkward at the start of the day, not knowing anyone. On Friday 25th of July, Koda and I were chosen to attend a film workshop with about 12-15 other schools. When we arrived at Bexhill Public School, we met Ms Hogan who works at Byron Public. She signed us in and then told us to go to the COLA. We were then split up into 2 different groups - one for script writing and one for filming. We were put into a group with Mr Evans who taught us about different filming angles like extreme closeup, over the shoulder and long shot. We got to go outside and practised filming. Koda and I didn't get very far but we took some videos. After that, we were called inside to watch our efforts. We saw some funny videos that other groups made. Then we swapped over to scriptwriting with Mr Walters. To start off, we watched a slide show and then we learned how to do dialogue. We wrote a short story about being stuck in a desert and having no water. After that, the bell rang and we went out to have lunch. This was followed by watching some of the 2024 film videos.

We headed back down to the COLA and Ms Hogan did a quiz of everything we learnt that day.






Thoughtful Parenting Online

Thoughtful Parenting is a 1.5 hour parenting program for parents & carers with children aged 0-12yrs old. In this program we explore children's brain development, helping explain why children behave the way they do and provide strategies to better manage our reactions to these behaviours. 1 x 1.5 hour session.



Anxiety Coach Online

Anxiety Coach is a child development course that aims to support parents and caregivers to take a preventative role in the development of anxiety problems and support children to develop skills to reduce anxiety. It is what we call a 'parent-led' approach, meaning that you take on the role of the coach in your child's life, and are able to guide them through difficult emotions when they arise. It is recommended for parents/carers with children aged 4-12 yrs. 3 x 2 hour sessions.



Cirlce of Security Online

The Circle of Security® Parenting™ program offers valuable insights into building secure, lasting relationships with your child, based on decades of research. Designed for parents and caregivers of children aged 0-12 years, this program focuses on strengthening the bond between you and your child. It emphasises the importance of learning from mistakes rather than aiming for perfection, helping you create a secure emotional foundation that will positively impact your child for a lifetime.
