Ideas to add more vegetables

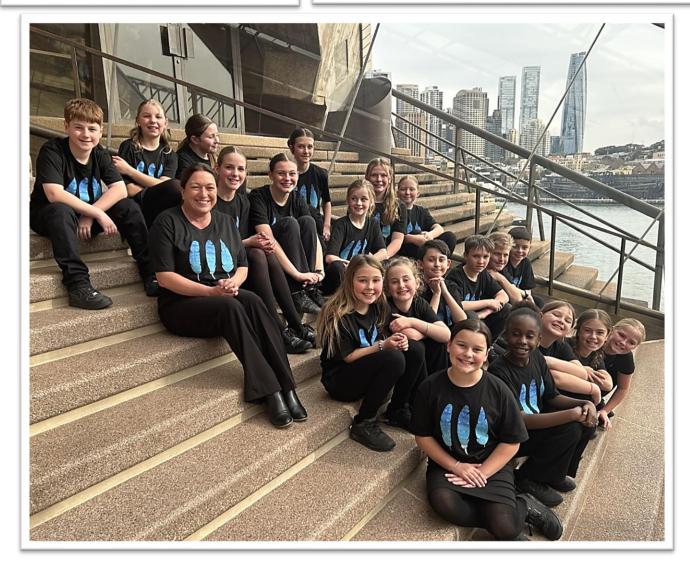












Be BOLD. BE KIND. SPEAK UP.

Students from Yrs 1-6 joined the Kids Helpline's Largest Anti-Bullying Lesson yesterday. After the session each class discussed what they had heard and chose three key points from their discussion.



1/2M

- Bullying is NOT OK, when you see it happening do something about it
- STAND UP tell a trusted adult, STAND OUT use strong words and speak out
- Not all bullying you can see. Some is hidden eg: online bullying or spreading stories

1/2T

- There is a big difference between being bullied and having a disagreement or a 'mean moment' with a friend
- It is never our fault if we are bullied
- We need to stand out by being brave when witnessing bullying behaviour

3/4J

- Treat everyone with kindness the way you want to be treated
- Don't just tell one adult tell parents, teachers and everyone to help stop bullying behaviour
- If you see bullying behaviour at Goulburn East; stay calm, interrupt the behaviour, remove yourself, offer support (RUOK?) and tell the teacher

3/4M

- There are three types of bullying: social, verbal and physical
- If you feel bullied or see someone being bullied, speak to a teacher or trusted adult
- Follow up after knowing someone has been bullied and check in with them later as it can make a difference

5/6D

- Stand up and call out bullying behaviour when we see it occur
- Be a trusted person that younger students can speak to if they are worried about telling a teacher
- Educate people who do the bullying so that they understand what they are doing and its impact on others
