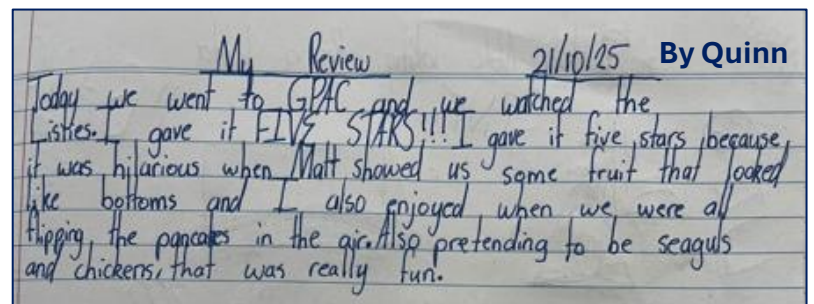
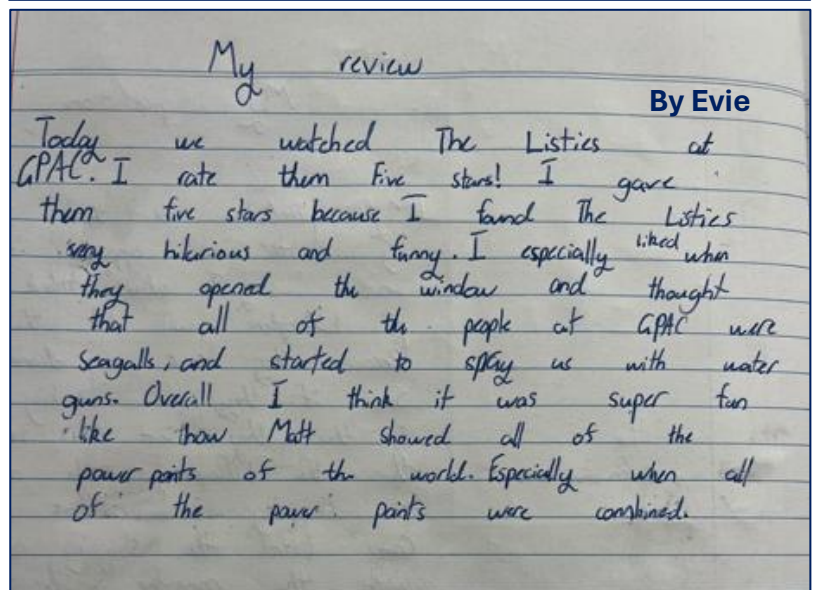
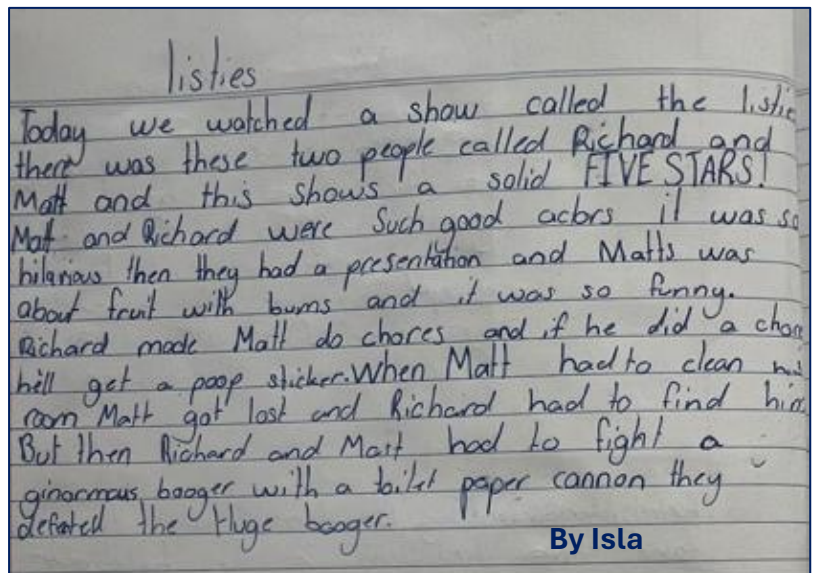
The Listies!

DEADLY SCIENCE

Deadly Science: Cyber Security

On Tuesday 28 October, students in Years 3 to Year 6 had the opportunity to participate in some online cyber security sessions hosted by Deadly Science. These sessions looked at cyber security and how students can remain safe online by creating strong passphrases. Students investigated how long it could take cyber criminals to hack various passwords, learning that strong passphrases can take years or even centuries to hack. The Deadly Science team shared that *"Every 6 minutes in Australia, someone falls victim to online fraud, scams, or hacking."* All students enjoyed creating their own passwords for a partner to attempt to hack and will hopefully change their own personal passwords to make it more difficult for hackers and scammers.

Hack the Password!

ACTIVITY 1:

Step 1:

- Choose your role: Hacker (Player 1) and The Target (Player 2)
- Player 2 (Target):** choose a 3-digit Code using only numbers between 1 and 6.
- Write it down on a Post-it Note so that you can remember it, but keep it secret from player 1.
- You can use the same number more than once in your 3-digit number.

Step 2:

- Player 1 (Hacker):** write your first guess in line one of the Table.

Step 3:

- Player 2:** in the grey boxes on line one, let player 1 know how good their guesses were.
- If a number is guessed correctly, and in the right position, give them a ✓
- If a number is guessed correctly, but in the wrong position, give them a ○
- If a number is not correct, and isn't in the code - give them a ✗

For example, if the target's secret code is 253, and the guess is 231. The result would be:

ENROLMENTS FOR KINDERGARTEN 2026

Kindergarten enrolments are now being taken for children who live in the Goulburn East zone and will turn 5 years old before 31 July 2026.

Please note that original documents will need to be sighted at the office, and 100 points of proof of address documents must be provided in accordance with the Residential Address Checklist which is available from the school office.

To finalise your child's enrolment you will need to bring along:

- Your child's birth certificate
- Your child's immunization certificate (available from Medicare)
- Proof of address documents
