

Greenway Park Public School: Celebrating and Growing Our Commitment to Aboriginal Education

As Relieving Deputy Principal and leader of Aboriginal Education at Greenway Park, I am proud to share the wonderful progress and our ongoing initiatives at Greenway Park Public School. Earlier this year in March, we proudly published our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP), setting out 14 meaningful actions to deepen our commitment to reconciliation. To date, we have successfully completed three of these actions, with the remaining eleven continuing as important annual commitments for our school community.

From 27 May to 3 June, we joined the nation in celebrating Reconciliation Week. I want to sincerely thank the many families and students who showed their support by creating a "Sea of Hands" – a beautiful display of unity made during Culture Club by our First Nations students who planted the hands around the yarning circle. This powerful symbol reflects our shared respect and connection. Students also created flowers for Sorry Day.

NAIDOC Week was celebrated in Week 1 this term, as it falls during the school holidays. Our students arrived under a balloon arch in the colours of the Aboriginal flag – red, black, and yellow. We held a mufti day where students dressed in Aboriginal flag colours, embracing cultural pride without the need for a gold coin donation. Teachers shared a red, black, and yellow morning tea, and Aboriginal parents were warmly invited to join us. We were honoured to have Aunty Dot and Ms Callen with us during these celebrations. Some of our Aboriginal students and our event ministers also spoke at our morning assembly, sharing insights and reflections on the significance of NAIDOC Week.

During the week, students visited the yarning circle to unpack the stories behind our school mural, discussing our totems, the country we are on, and Aboriginal symbols. Classes then explored the mural with their buddy classes, reflecting on artist Danielle Mate's designs and what they saw that reflected our community.

Our Year 6 students prepared inspiring slideshows on notable First Nations people, which they shared with their classes. Our librarian, Ms Scheepers, supported our efforts by wrapping Aboriginal books for classroom use. Looking ahead, the "Deadly Doors" competition is underway. In Aboriginal English, "deadly" is used as a term of praise and admiration, meaning "excellent," "fantastic," or "awesome" (rather than its literal meaning). It's a way to celebrate skills, achievements, and cultural pride. Some classes have already started decorating their doors, with all entries to be completed over the term. The Principal and Deputy Principals will also be decorating their doors, and students will have the opportunity to judge the best door.

The winner will be announced at the end of the term. This competition encourages creativity and cultural pride, keeping Aboriginal perspectives visible and fostering meaningful conversations throughout the school.

Our Culture Club for Aboriginal students, which now runs three times a term, has grown to include a mentor program partnering our students with Aboriginal mentors from John Edmondson High School. This initiative will foster strong relationships and support networks across schools.

Lost Property



A huge congratulations to Zabeer and Aaliyah who proudly represented GPPS in the NSW Premier's Spelling Bee regional finals last Friday!






Stage 2 competition

P&C UPDATE - TERM THREE 2025

The last term has seen a lot of work behind the scenes for P&C as we continue to process the feedback from our parent survey. Our general meetings, held each term in weeks 3 and 7, have been trialled on different days, and it's been great to see some new faces at our meetings along with new volunteers getting involved in P&C events. While our planned evening information session has been postponed, we are working on a new date in Term 4 and look forward to welcoming more of the community once the session is confirmed.

P&C held a merchandise stall at the school Athletics Carnival in late Term 3, selling house colour items to help students support their teams. This event saw over \$500 in sales, money that goes back to students via P&C contributions throughout the year.

Our secondhand uniform sales and stalls continue all year round, with four stalls a term and online sales available at any time during school terms. The items we sell are kindly donated by the school community, which means we can keep prices low while also keeping clothing out of landfill. We are currently running low on a number of uniform items, particularly in sizes 8, 10 & 12, so we'd encourage families to donate any good quality used uniform they might have so we can continue to successfully run secondhand uniform sales. Donations can be dropped to the school office at any time during school terms.

We are currently a few days away from one of our bigger events of the year, the annual Father's Day stall. Students will be able to purchase gifts for \$5, \$7 or \$10. A massive thanks to all the parent volunteers who assist both in the lead up and on the day of the stall; events like this don't happen without their hard work and dedication.

As families would know, the school recently ran the annual Book Fair, and P&C were very pleased to be able to purchase \$250 worth of books to donate to the library. These books will be available on the library shelves very soon.





We are currently in discussions with the school about other financial contributions P&C can make to benefit all students, and look forward to updating the community once these are finalised.

SECOND HAND UNIFORM ORDERS

For ONLINE ORDERS, the order process is as follows –

- 1. Please email gppssecondhand@gmail.com with a list of items and sizes required, along with your child's name and class. Email requests can be sent through on weekdays during the school term. We will attempt to reply asap.
- 2. As orders are received, stock will be checked and items available will be confirmed via return email, along with payment due. PAYMENT is ONLINE ONLY. Orders will only be packed once payment is received.
- 3. ORDER CUT-OFF including payment is every Wednesday by 3pm. Your items will then be packed and delivered to your child's class by the Friday of that week. NOTE that orders paid after the cut-off time will be carried over to the following week.

Kindergarten Enrolments

We are taking Kindergarten enrolments and accepting applications for Kindergarten 2026. Any child who turns 5 before 31st July 2021 is eligible to start school at the beginning of next year.

To help us with our organisation of classes for 2026, parents are asked to either do an online enrolment or fill in an Application to Enrol form and return it to the office by the 30th of August 2025.



If you have moved out of the area, have students already at this school and have a child who will start kindergarten next year, you will need to fill in an out of area enrolment application.

Application to enrol forms and out of area forms are available online and from the school office.
