#### **BEHAVIOUR FLOWCHART**

#### Classroom

## **Unsatisfactory Behaviours:**

- Language/Swearing (Low level- not directed at anyone or disrupting learning)
- Lateness
- Incomplete classwork
- Lack of preparedness
- Calling out
- Put downs
- Teasing
- Throwing
- Disrupting the learning of others
- Refusing to follow a reasonable request
- Writing on the school property in class
- Misuse of school technology
- Dishonesty
- Playful rough play
- Leaving a lesson without permission.
- Out of bounds

If deemed as a dangerous or critical incident, the teacher sends another student to get AP/HT or DP.

### **Teacher managed**

# Classroom Teacher

# Interventions may include:

- Use re- directional strategies
- Proximity control
- Non-Verbal cues to correct behaviour
- Verbal warning to student
- Conference with student
- In class modified seating
- Take-up time
- Reflection desk
- Timeout/ detention with teacher and recorded on Sentral.
- 2 incidences in a 2 weeks= phone call to parents from classroom teacher/ teacher

If inappropriate behaviour continues:

- 1. Use intervention/s above
- 2. Written warning- name on the board
- **3**. Cross against name = 5 mins class detention
- **4**. 2nd cross = 10 mins class detention
- **5.** 3rd cross, sent to an AP/HT.
- \*\*These warnings are an accumulation of any inappropriate behaviour.
- \*\*You may choose to allow students to work off crosses.

#### **Playground**

#### The duty teacher will:

- **1.** Provide a warning to student/s and redirect inappropriate behaviour.
- 2. If student behaviour continues, students will be required to walk with the teacher or sit in a reflection seat in the playground (Primary). This behaviour is recorded on Sentral by the teacher on duty.
- 3. If the student continues behaviour or refuses to follow teacher's directions, this behaviour becomes Executive managed. Request Executive support.

# **LEVEL B: Assistant Principal/Head Teacher Managed**

# LEVEL B unsatisfactory behaviours may include but are not limited to:

- Continual refusal to follow reasonable request
- Intimidation/Harassment
- Anti-social behaviour (pushing another student, rough play- tackling)
- Continual minor infractions
- Swearing at another student
- Minor threats to another student
- Uniform (monitored daily)
- Disrespect when representing the school (minor)

#### **Assistant Principal Interventions may include:**

- Interview with the student.
- Mediation between students.
- Referral to LST members, Counsellor, ARCO or Mandatory Report
- 2 Executive Detentions
- 2 days on the Banned List

N.B. If the classroom teacher sends a student to the AP, the student will then remain with the AP for at least the remainder of the session

## **Head Teacher Interventions may include:**

- Interview with the student.
- Mediation between students.
- Referral to LST, Counsellor, ARCO or Mandatory Report
- 2 Executive Detentions
- Cs on card = an extra day on the card
- Repeated non-compliance on the card will move up a level.

Students need to get their monitoring cards signed each session by the teacher on duty or classroom teacher.

- Aggressive language

- 3 Executive Detentions,
- 3 days on Monitoring Card
- 3 Days on the Banned List
- One monitoring card cross= 1 additional detention.
- Two monitoring card crosses= move up a Level or re-start Level C.

Students need to get their monitoring cards signed each session by the teacher on duty or classroom teacher.

N.B. If the classroom teacher sends a student to the AP, the student will then remain with the A.P for at least the remainder of the session.

Level C letter sent electronically or with student and parents contacted electronically/ phone

LEVEL D: DEPUTY PRINCIPAL MANAGED

- Referral to LST members, Counsellor, ARCO or Mandatory Report
- 2 Executive Detentions
- 5 days on a Monitoring Card
- 5 days on the banned list (must be off the card to be off the banned list)
- Cs on card = an extra day on the card
- Repeated non-compliance on the card will move up a level.

Students need to get their monitoring cards signed each session by the teacher on duty or classroom teacher.

N.B. If the classroom teacher sends a student to the HT, the student will remain with the HT for the remainder of the session, and the teacher will need to provide work for the student to complete.

## Record on Sentral

#### LEVEL D unsatisfactory behaviours may include but are not limited to:

- Continued disobedience after HT/AP intervention
- Aggressive behaviour and/or language
- Major Theft
- Swearing in response to staff instructions
- Truancy from school
- Bullying

#### **DP** interventions may include:

- Interview with the student.
- Mediation between students.
- Ready to Play/ Learn Plans
- Referral to LST members, Counsellor, ARCO or Mandatory Report, Outside Agencies
- Up to 1 day withdrawal
- 4 detentions
- 4 days on a Monitoring Card

## **DP** Interventions may include:

- Interview with the student.
- Mediation between students.
- Development of a Student Support Plan
- Referral to LST members, Counsellor, ARCO or Mandatory Report, Outside Agencies
- Isolation from normal classes
- 2 Executive Detentions
- 5 days on a Monitoring card

- Racism
- Using a phone or electronic device to intimidate or harass or to take photos without permission at school
- Major vandalism
- Major threats to another student

#### Recorded on Sentral

N.B. Isolation triggers a Level D A Formal Caution to Suspend also triggers a Level D.

- 4 days on the Banned List
- Students need to get their monitoring cards signed each lesson/session by the teacher on duty or the classroom teacher.
- Primary students report daily to the detention room to get their card signed.
- One monitoring card cross= 1 additional detention.
- Two monitoring card crosses= move up a Level
   D- Caution to Suspend or re-start Level

Level D letter sent electronically or with students and parents contacted electronically/ phone.

N.B. If the AP sends a student to the DP, the student will then remain with the DP or support services, if required.

- 10 days on the banned list (must be off the card to be off the banned list)
- Cs on card = an extra day on the card
- Repeated non-compliance on the card may result in restarting the card or a Formal Caution

Students need to get their monitoring cards signed each session by the teacher on duty or classroom teacher.

N.B. If the HT sends a student to the DP, the student will then remain with the DP or support services until a resolution is reached.

#### **LEVEL E: SUSPENSION**

#### Level E unsatisfactory behaviours include:

- continued/persistent disobedience and/or disruptive behaviour
- malicious damage to or theft of property
- verbal abuse towards a staff member
- Possession of prohibited substances
- Possession of a weapon
- Physical Violence or serious threats of violence
- Criminal behaviour related to the school
- Sexualised behaviour

#### **DP/Principal interventions may include:**

- Immediate suspension of 1 10 days
- 5 days on a Monitoring card
- 15 days on the banned list (5 days for Primary)
- Cs on card (crosses for Primary) = an extra day on the card
- Repeated non-compliance on the card may result in Isolation, Formal Cautions or suspensions.

In certain circumstances, the principal may determine that a student should be suspended without issuing a formal caution to suspend because there are immediate and significant risks to health, safety and wellbeing for students or staff that cannot be otherwise mitigated.
