Bushfire Planning - IT'S BUSHFIRE SEASON

It's bushfire season and we need to keep informed of all bushfire activity and possible impact on our school over the summer period.

Henry Fulton Public School is in Greater Sydney Region Fire Weather District. The school is identified as **Category 2** and is in a bushfire prone area with **high** bushfire risk. We will be directed by the department to proactively temporarily cease school operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been issued for the following day, or on advice from emergency services or the State Emergency Operations Centre.

As a community we will need to watch for and understand all fire danger ratings and act if necessary.

The Australian Warning System Alert Levels

There are four alert levels related to bushfires which will determine our actions in the event of a bushfire or emergency. These are updated regularly during a bushfire event.

- **Emergency Warning** the highest level of Bushfire Alert. You may be in danger and need to take action immediately. Any delay now puts your life at risk.
- Watch and Act there is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start taking action now to protect you and your school community.
- **Advice** a fire has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.
- Incident registered A white triangle indicates an incident (bushfire or other) has been registered and is currently under investigation. There is no action to be taken at this time.

It is recommended that we all have the **Hazards Near Me app** on our phones and be ready to receive messages from the school if there is a bushfire emergency close by.

Stay alert, be ready and keep informed.

Kindergarten 2026

If you have a child who is turning 5 years old by 31st July 2026, they are eligible to commence Kindergarten in 2026.

We will have a series of orientation sessions in Term 4 which will be sent this week to all that we know are enrolling with us. So, we can add you to the list and let you know of all the plans, dates and events, please don't delay in getting your application to enrol completed. If you know of anyone still to do so, please urge them to come forward. Get those applications in and contact the office if you have any questions.

If you know someone who may be in our newly added intake area, please let them know they can enrol with us. This are ai shared with Samuel Terry Public School. Parents can currently choose to come to Henry Fulton Public School. These are the newly assigned areas:

- Reassignment of a residential area bordered by the Andromeda Playing Fields, Procyon Place and Sextans Place to the north
- The Northern Road to the east, Linden Crescent and Andromeda Drive to the west and Andromeda Drive to the south from Samuel Terry Public School to Henry Fulton Public School
- A residential dwelling on Kenilworth Crescent, is reassigned from Samuel Terry PS to Henry Fulton PS aligning it with all other families on this street.

Overnight Excursions

We usually plan an overnight excursion for Stage Three every year and one for Stage Two every second year.

The cost of overnight excursions can be very high, and we always try and keep this in mind when making our bookings which usually have to be made, a full year ahead. We find that some

are prohibitive, meaning they are just too costly, and we haven't been able to get enough participation to cover costs for some of these in the past.

We need to be mindful in a smaller school that it requires a lot of staff so there is adequate supervision, need to have a strong educational purpose and be value for money. All things considered we are going to offer a Canberra overnight excursion for Stage Three in 2026 and if we get commitment from enough families for this, we will go ahead. The price will be in the range of between \$450-\$500 for two nights and three-days. We will be asking for expressions of interest first. If there is enough interest, then a substantial non-refundable deposit quite soon. This will indicate if families will be able and willing to meet this cost.

For Stage Two in 2026, we are making inquiries for appropriate and available venues. We will let you know how our planning goes.

The Anxiety Coach- Parent workshops

The Anxiety Coach is a child development course designed and developed by psychologist, author and teacher Michael Hawton that equips parents with a practical and easy set of tools, and a solid understanding of the theory behind these to enable parents to build resilience in their child.

Thank you to all the parents and caregivers who attended the first two sessions of The Anxiety Coach. Our first session focused on the theory of the program and how the developing brain responds to stressors. Our second session focused on change and introduced the 'five-star model'. In our last session we will focus on how to support your child to face everyday challenges and introduce strategies to use at home. Each session has been filled with learning, discussion and sharing ideas.

We look forward to seeing all parents and caregivers attend our final session this week.

PALS -Playing and Learning to Socialise -Social Skills Program

Our Kindergarten students have now completed the PALS Social Skills Program lead by our classroom teachers. This ten-week program teaches children about greeting others, listening, sharing, taking turns, dealing with feelings of fear, sadness and anger and solving problems. While many children appear to learn these skills with little difficulty, there are a number of children who require extra support to develop these essential skills. The PALS program has been found effective in helping children develop socially skilled behaviour.

In each lesson the students focused on a particular skill and the program gradually progressed to more complex skills required for successful social interaction. The students enjoyed singing songs, role playing and using puppets to learn these social skill concepts.

Sustainability

Intake Area Adjustment

At times it is necessary for the department to adjust a school's local enrolment area. Intake area changes happen to better balance enrolments, utilise assets and capacity across schools, ensuring students continue to have access to high-quality public education.

For Henry Fulton Public School, our intake area has increased slightly as there has been movement of the boundary between Henry Fulton Public School and Samuel Terry Public School.

Parents, you may be wondering how this affects you if you live in the new intake area. I hope the following information is helpful, however please contact the school if you have any other questions.

This is the **mapping information** we have been given followed by some common questions and answers.

- Reassignment of a residential area bordered by the Andromeda Playing Fields, Procyon Place and Sextans Place to the north
- The Northern Road to the east, Linden Crescent and Andromeda Drive to the west and Andromeda Drive to the south from Samuel Terry Public School to Henry Fulton Public School
- A residential dwelling on Kenilworth Crescent, is reassigned from Samuel Terry PS to Henry Fulton PS aligning it with all other families on this street.

Q. I live in the area that is changing. What does this mean for me?

A. The revised intake area will be uploaded to School Finder and take effect immediately. A transition period will be in place for all affected families for a period of 12 months from the date of implementation. During this transition period families in the identified areas of change will be considered local to both schools with the option to enrol at either. At the conclusion of the transition period the option to enrol at the two schools will no longer apply and families will only be guaranteed enrolment at their new local school. The 12-month transition period is expected to end at the end on Term 2, 2026.

Q. I have a child already attending one of the above schools, can they stay there even if I am now in a new intake area?

A. Yes, they can. There is no change for students already attending a school. They can complete their education at the school they originally enrolled into.

Q. Will siblings have to attend different schools when the intake area changes?

A. If you have a child already attending a public school, you can apply to enrol siblings at the same school under the standard Department of Education enrolment policies. Please contact your school for more information if you have specific questions or concerns.

Q. I have already lodged my child's enrolment application form for kindergarten 2026. What do these changes mean for my child?

A. Applications that have been processed and accepted will not be affected, including kindergarten 2026 enrolments. For families residing in the area of change the option to apply to the alternate school is also available to you.

Q. My circumstances are challenging, and I think this school is best for my child. We live outside the school's intake area. What should I do?

A. We understand that not everyone's circumstances are the same, and that there are instances where exceptional and compelling circumstances will need to be considered. If this is the case, you should talk to the principal of your local school. Non-local enrolment applications for children living outside of the proposed intake areas will be considered on a case-by-case basis in line with the Department's enrolment policy.

School Awards

- Keep all your awards safe at home.
- When you have 5 Good News Awards, hand them to the teacher to get your Special Award.
- Collect 3 Special Awards and you can get a Henry Fulton Award.
- After three Henry Fulton Awards you can choose your Principal Award-medallion or trophy.
- Henry Fulton Awards and Principal Awards are handed out at K-6 Assemblies.
- **Positive Behaviour Awards (PBL)** awards are also very important. It means you are Aiming High, a Safe, Responsible and Respectful learner.
