Please join us in congratulating Andrew Jones on this well-deserved appointment. We are excited to support him as he embarks on this new chapter in his career!



Where Are They Now - Jaykob Gavin

I graduated from Henry Lawson High School in 2015. During my time at Henry Lawson High School, I developed a strong interest in sports and extracurricular activities, even though I wasn't the most academically focused student. Throughout my school years, I participated in various sports, including rugby league, soccer, and cricket. I was also a member of the school's science and engineering team, which represented the school at the national finals. These experiences helped me cultivate important skills in teamwork, leadership, and communication, while also forming lifelong friendships.

At Henry Lawson High School, my favourite subjects were sport and mathematics. After graduation, I continued to pursue my passion for sports by playing rugby league for the Grenfell Goannas. I worked for GrainCorp during harvest and took on various laboring roles, including concreting. In 2016, I began working at Grenfell Hospital doing general maintenance and groundskeeping, and I joined Fire and Rescue NSW as a retained firefighter in 2017.

In late 2019, I decided to pursue a career in law enforcement and applied to join the NSW Police Force. I was accepted into the NSW Police Academy in January 2020, and after completing my training, I took my oath of office as a Probationary Constable on June 19, 2020.

I was posted to Parkes Police Station in the Central West Police District, where I successfully completed my 12-month probationary period and was promoted to the rank of Constable. In 2022, I transitioned to the Parkes Detectives Office, and after passing the "Bullring" assessment on November 9, 2022, I was promoted to the rank of Plain Clothes Constable, taking on a permanent position in Criminal Investigations.

As part of my professional development, I began the Detectives Education Program (DEP), which focused on criminal investigation processes, evidentiary law, and investigation methodology. This program involved extensive coursework and examinations in complex areas such as drug supply and homicide investigations. On August 30, 2024, I was officially designated as a Detective Constable, continuing my work in the Parkes Detectives Office.

Throughout my career in the NSW Police Force, I have developed critical problem-solving skills and gained valuable experience in high-pressure, life-threatening situations. These experiences have highlighted the importance of effective teamwork, clear communication, and sound decision-making in high-risk environments.

Reflecting on my time at Henry Lawson High School, I fondly remember the friendships and experiences that have shaped my personal and professional life. While I may not have been the top academic performer, my commitment to perseverance, continuous learning, and teamwork has been essential to my success. I am proud of the path I have taken and remain grateful for the skills and values I developed during my time at school, which continue to guide me in

my career today.


