

#### **Western Athletics**

On Friday 1<sup>st</sup> August, 9 students from The Henry Lawson represented at the Western Region Athletics Carnival in Bathurst. All students placed in the top 10 of their events out of 25-30 total competitors. Riley Dennis placed 10th in shotput (3.58m) and 7<sup>th</sup> in discus (11.68m), Wyatt Bruce placed 7<sup>th</sup> in javelin (20.63m), Patrick Heathcote placed 4<sup>th</sup> in 800m (3:04.33) and 5<sup>th</sup> in discus (27.53), Josh Freebody placed 4<sup>th</sup> in 800m (2:33.80), 5<sup>th</sup> in discus (27.53) and 9<sup>th</sup> in 400m (1:07.10), Daisy Forde placed 5<sup>th</sup> in 800m (3:01.39) and 7<sup>th</sup> in 1500m (6:21.05), Lachlan Torpy placed 1<sup>st</sup> in 400m (1:01.36) and 11<sup>th</sup> in 100m sprint (13.51), Penny Hughes placed 1<sup>st</sup> in 100m sprint (13.52), 2<sup>nd</sup> in 200m sprint (28.43) and 2<sup>nd</sup> in long jump (4.45m) and Sophie Hughes placed 1<sup>st</sup> in shotput (9.99m), 1st in discus (27.39m) and 3<sup>rd</sup> in javelin (26.60m).


