

Ryan Toole at the Long Tan commemorations

On Monday, 18 August, Ryan attended the Long Tan commemorations, where he shared a powerful and heartfelt story drawn from his grandfather's lived experiences on that significant day in history. His moving words offered a personal connection to the bravery and sacrifice of those who served, reminding us all of the enduring impact of their service.

Ryan's story follows below.

I would like to speak to you this afternoon about my grandfather, Private Allan Keith Russell. Who at the age of 21 was conscripted to The Royal Australian Regiment and served from June 1966 to June 1967. He was present at the Battle of Long Tan in Alpha Company, 6th Battalion.

I would like to relay a memory he retold me recently about his experience in Vietnam.

On Long Tan Day my grandfather was transferred from One ARU to Nui Dat with a friend of his. Upon arrival at Nui Dat, he noticed a large line of APCs and there were people running everywhere. When he got off the truck a Sergeant told him to throw his gear down and get on one of the APCs. They then progressed to the river which was halfway between their base and Long Tan. Once they reached the river they stopped as they had to wait for the OC who was the commander of the task force. He wanted them to wait there so he could go in with them. My grandfather's captain said after 10 minutes they would leave one APC there for him and advance to Long Tan. Luckily, they did as the soldiers were becoming agitated at being made to wait. When he finally arrived at Long Tan he was met with chaos seeing hundreds of Vietcong emerging from the undergrowth of the rubber plantation. After a short time of heavy battle in the pouring rain the enemy began to flee. By dark everything had quietened down, in the morning they were directed to follow the Vietcong. They got so close that mud was dripping off the leaves where they had walked through the plantation, however, they didn't catch up to them.

This recollection from my grandfather leaves me with feelings of pride and understanding of their bravery and determination in the face of unimaginable fear of danger. It leaves me with a lasting respect not only for my grandfather but for all veterans who have fought for our country.






YES Program


