School Counsellor

I'd briefly like to introduce myself. My name is Anthony Baker, your new school counsellor. I'm a former teacher with 23 years of teaching experience. I've mainly taught Secondary Science at Macksville HS and Coffs High but also taught a composite 5-6 primary class in Grafton.

I'm a provisionally registered Psychologist with AHPRA and employed with the Department as a school counsellor. I currently service Bellingen HS, Dorrigo PS, Hernani PS and Dundurrabin PS.

As a school counsellor, I can provide screening for children who may be experiencing emotional, behavioural or learning difficulties. Typically, I then construct a report which can be used for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes by paediatricians or external psychologists (or clinical psychologists). I can also offer limited, short-term counselling

and intervention services for students who may be encountering difficulties in their lives.

Due to the age of primary school children, 1-1 contact is strictly by parental consent. If your child currently has contact with the school counsellor, or you think they may do so in the near future (this year), I have provided a permission note for your convenience, which will need to be signed and returned to the school.

All contact and relevant documentation associated with the school counselling service is STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL (as per AHPRA requirements).

If you wish to talk with me, please feel free to contact the office (66 576 155) to make an appointment. My service days at Hernani are alternate Thursday mornings.


