

Enrolments 2026

Professional learning update

Our Staff Development Day on Monday 21 July saw teachers engaged in a full day's learning of behaviour management strategies and this learning will continue over the term. During Term 3 teachers are continuing to learn, trial and implement a variety of High Potential Gifted Education (HPGE) differentiation and explicit teaching strategies and are investigating new syllabuses content for History, Geography, PDHPE and Science for implementation 2026-2027.

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2025 Performance and Improvement results

Student achievement in NAPLAN is reported using proficiency standards for each assessment area at each year level. The standards are set at a challenging but reasonable expectation of what students know and can do at the time of testing. There are four proficiency levels:



Exceeding: the student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.

Strong: the student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.

Developing: the student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.

Needs additional support: the student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes that are expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

Year 3 and 5 student NAPLAN 2025 results were sent home last week. Please check your child's bag and contact the school if you have not received them.

- Year 3 Reading 61.1% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels
- Year 3 Writing 68.9% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels
- Year 3 Grammar and punctuation 61.1% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels
- Year 3 Spelling 61.1% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels

An overview of our school Year 3 NAPLAN Performance:

- Year 3 Numeracy 72.3% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 3 Reading 61.1% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 3 Writing 88.9% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 3 Grammar and Punctuation 61.1% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 3 Spelling 61.1% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong

An overview of our school Year 5 NAPLAN improvement:

- Year 5 Reading 1.8% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels
- Year 5 Writing 13.5% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels
- Year 5 Grammar and punctuation 24% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels
- Year 5 Spelling 16.4% improvement into the exceeding and strong proficiency levels

An overview of our school YEAR 5 NAPLAN performance:

- Year 5 Numeracy 72% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 5 Reading 80% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 5 Writing 68% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 5 Grammar and punctuation 76% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong
- Year 5 Spelling 80% of students are in the two proficiency levels of exceeding and strong

Our Year 3 students have shown tremendous progress in several key areas. In reading, the number of students exceeding expectations has soared from 0.0% to 27.8%, with a significant decrease in those needing additional support, down from 66.7% to just 5.6%. This reflects the dedication of both our students and teachers to literacy excellence. Year 3 spelling achievements are noteworthy, with the exceeding category rising to 27.8% and all students moving out of the needs additional support category. Although numeracy saw a slight decline in the exceeding category, with targeted strategies, we are optimistic about further improvements. In writing, there has been a remarkable increase in students achieving strong performance, jumping from 20.0% to 83.3%, while those needing additional support have decreased significantly to 0.0%. Similarly, grammar and punctuation have seen impressive gains, with strong performance up to 50.0% and a dramatic reduction in the needs additional support category.

Year 5 in numeracy, we've seen a substantial increase in students exceeding expectations, jumping from 0.0% to 12.0%. Additionally, the number of students needing additional support has decreased significantly, showcasing the effectiveness of our targeted support strategies. Our Year 5 students have shown resilience in reading, with a slight increase in the exceeding category and a stable rate of students needing additional support, indicating consistent progress in literacy. In writing, there has been a rise in students performing strongly, up to 64.0%, while those needing additional help have decreased, reflecting our commitment to

enhancing writing skills. Grammar and punctuation have seen outstanding growth, with 24.0% of students now exceeding expectations and a significant reduction in those needing additional support. Spelling continues to be a strong area, with increases in both exceeding and strong performance categories, ensuring our students are well-prepared for future challenges.

Semester 2 Goals

As we begin Term 3, we will be focusing on setting Semester 2 goals for our students in the first few weeks. Please keep an eye on your child's School Bytes Portal for their new semester goals. These goals are designed to support their learning journey and help them achieve their full potential. We encourage you to discuss these goals with your child and support them in reaching their objectives this term. Thank you for your partnership in fostering their growth!

Parent Teacher Interviews

These interviews provide a valuable opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss your child's progress and achievements, as well as to set new learning goals for Semester 2. NSW Health Primary School Dental Program

NSW Health is working with the Department of Education and public primary schools to offer free dental check-ups and preventive care, to all students as part of a school-based mobile dental program. Our school has been selected to participate the program.

Many parents may not realise two important things about their children's teeth:

- 1. Good oral health is essential for children to successfully learn and participate at school, and
- 2. NSW Health offers free public dental health services to all children under 18 years of age.

Learning and behaviour difficulties at school can start with tooth and gum problems. That's because decay and gum disease can cause pain and difficulties in eating, sleeping, talking, concentrating, and learning, which can in turn affect a child's behaviour in class. A child with tooth decay may feel self-conscious about the way their teeth look and feel, making it harder for them to join in class and social activities.

Our school is participating in the program and offering students the opportunity to have free dental checkups in a comfortable and familiar environment at school. With a parent/carers consent, students are able to have a free dental check-up and free preventive care.

The program is scheduled to visit our school in Week 10 from 22 September to 26 September 2025.

A Parent Information and Consent Pack will be sent home with each student, and includes information sheets, consent forms and the program privacy statement. Parents/carers who want their child to receive care are advised to:

- NSW Health Mobile Dental Program
 - Eat more fruit and wegles as a drink



- 1. Read all the information provided in the pack
- 2. Carefully complete all the fields of the consent forms
- 3. Return the consent forms to the school as soon as possible

It is not usual practice for parents to attend these school-based appointments.

Seasons for Growth is an evidence-based change, loss and grief education program that uses the imagery of the seasons to illustrate the experience of change, loss and grief. Children and young people can experience grief following significant changes and losses:

- Someone they love dies
- Separation and divorce
- Friendship changes
- Illness impacts their life
- Relocation
- Natural disasters.

Seasons for Growth

Coming to HPS Term 3

Life is like the seasons



Seasons for Growth aims to strengthen the social and emotional wellbeing of children and young people by:

- Exploring the impact of change and loss on every-day life
- Learning new ways to respond to these changes.

The Seasons for Growth Children and Young People's Program is a small group program which runs for 45 minutes over eight weeks. The program offers four levels with tailored, developmentally appropriate activities and discussions.

- Level 1: 6 8 years
- Level 2: 9 10 years
- Level 3: 11 12 years
- Level 4: 13 18 years

Each session explores a theme using the seasonal imagery:

- Life is like the Seasons
- Change is Part of Life
- Valuing My Story
- Caring for my Feelings
- Making Good Choices.

The program provides a safe space for children and young people where they can give voice to their experiences, understand their feelings, learn problem-solving and decision-making skills, develop friendships, and recognise they are not alone. A Seasons for Growth journal is provided to each participant to document their learning journey. If you wish for your child/young person to participate in the program please contact the office. 
Canteen
