Year 6 Fundraising and Leadership Opportunities

It was heartwarming to see our Year 6 students demonstrate remarkable leadership and mentoring skills, guiding their peers and fostering a collaborative spirit while they raised money for their Year 6 Farewell. Their efforts produced a staggering \$612 to go towards their farewell. Our Year 6 students are planning another fundraiser this term, information to come. During this term our Year 6 leaders will be organising Curriculum Workshops on Wednesday 17 September for all the students K-5 to engage in. This is a great leadership opportunity.

Peer Mediator Training Years 4, 5 and 6

Our Year 6, 5 and 4 students are engaging in Peer Mediation training on Wednesday 10 September. This initiative aims to equip students with essential conflict resolution skills, fostering a positive school environment. Our students will learn effective communication techniques, active listening and problem-solving strategies that will empower them to mediate conflicts among their peers. The training will be interactive and engaging, providing students with practical tools they can use in real-life situations. By becoming peer mediators, students will not only enhance their leadership skills but also contribute to a more harmonious school community.

Everyday counts

Just a reminder that regular school attendance is crucial for your child's education. We acknowledge that there has been a lot of illness, but there are still students having days off when not ill. Missing just one day per week can add up to eight weeks over a year, resulting in 2.5 years of lost learning over their school life. Even missing one day per fortnight can accumulate to four weeks in a year, equating to a full year of missed education. It's important to prioritise consistent



attendance to ensure your child doesn't fall behind or continues to feel a sense of belonging at school. Please reach out to your child's classroom teacher, one of our Assistant Principals, or me if you need any advice or assistance regarding school attendance.

Public School Student Survey Results are in

Our students in Years 3-6 Term 2 participated in the Public School Student Survey.

Here are strengths:

High Expectations
 School: 97% | SSSG: 94% | NSW: 94%

The school outperforms its peers and the state average, indicating a strong academic culture and teacher expectations.

Classroom Management
 School: 90% | SSSG: 87% | NSW: 87%

Our school outperforms its peers and the state average which contributes to a conducive learning environment.

Engagement & Explicit Teaching
 Engagement: 86% | Explicit Teaching: 90%

Both metrics are slightly higher than SSSG and NSW, showing that students feel involved and understand lesson objectives clearly.

 Sense of Belonging (Overall, Connectedness, Supportive Adult) School scores 82–88% across all belonging indicators

Consistent with or slightly above peers and NSW averages, suggesting strong emotional and social support for students.

• Experienced Bullying School: 23% | SSSG: 38% | NSW: 40%

This is a major positive outcome, the school has far lower bullying rates than peers and state.

• Experienced Discrimination School: 27% | SSSG: 32% | NSW: 34%

Again, a positive sign the school has lower discrimination incidents than the peers and state average.

Here are areas for improvement:

• Effective Feedback School: 75% | SSSG: 76% | NSW: 76%

Slightly below both comparison groups.

• Motivation School: 76% | SSSG: 78% | NSW: 77%

A minor gap, but still an opportunity to boost student enthusiasm and interest in learning and embedding feedback structures on goal setting and during learning could be enhanced.



NSW Health Primary School Dental Program

NSW Health is working with the Department of Education and public primary schools to offer free dental check-ups and preventive care, to all students as part of a school-based mobile dental program. Our school has been selected to participate the program.

Many parents may not realise two important things about their children's teeth:



- 1. Good oral health is essential for children to successfully learn and participate at school, and
- 2. NSW Health offers free public dental health services to all children under 18 years of age.

Learning and behaviour difficulties at school can start with tooth and gum problems. That's because decay and gum disease can cause pain and difficulties in eating, sleeping, talking, concentrating, and learning, which can in turn affect a child's behaviour in class. A child with tooth decay may feel self-conscious about the way their teeth look and feel, making it harder for them to join in class and social activities.

Our school is participating in the program and offering students the opportunity to have free dental checkups in a comfortable and familiar environment at school. With a parent/carers consent, students are able to have a free dental check-up and free preventive care.

The program is scheduled to visit our school in Week 10 from 22 September to 26 September 2025.

A Parent Information and Consent Pack will be sent home with each student, and includes information sheets, consent forms and the program privacy statement. Parents/carers who want their child to receive care are advised to:



- 1. Read all the information provided in the pack
- 2. Carefully complete all the fields of the consent forms
- 3. Return the consent forms to the school as soon as possible

It is not usual practice for parents to attend these school-based appointments.

If you wish to accompany your child to their dental appointment, please contact NSW Health Public Dental Services Central Coast on phone: 1300 789 404 to make an appointment at one of their NSW Health Dental Clinics.


