## Curriculum Reform and Staff professional learning update - Casual teachers

During Term 4 our school is focused on curriculum reform, with staff engaged in professional learning on the new HSIE, Science, CAPA, and PDHPE syllabuses ahead of their 2026 implementation. Teachers have devoted significant time both during and after school to learn detailed scope and sequences, explore and unpack unit content and consider assessment and reporting requirements. We are also examining specific teaching strategies for each syllabus to ensure effective and engaging delivery. These preparations will enable us to confidently introduce the refreshed curriculum and continue offering high-quality learning opportunities.

As part of our school's commitment to ongoing professional learning, teachers will be replaced in the classroom by casual teachers. This allows our staff to participate in important training while ensuring that your child's learning continues without interruption.

Each morning, we provide an induction for casual teachers to familiarise them with our school environment, class routines and student needs. We also take this opportunity to remind our students about behaviour expectations. We emphasise that the presence of a casual teacher is not an excuse for poor behaviour. All

students are expected to uphold our school's behaviour standards, and any inappropriate behaviour will be addressed through the usual school processes.

These expectations reflect the values of our community, staff, students and the Department of Education. We kindly ask that you discuss this with your child and support our school in maintaining a respectful and positive learning environment.

## Online safety and supervision: Navigating TikTok, Roblox and other Apps

As much as social media platforms and online games like TikTok and Roblox offer fun and creative outlets for students, it's important for parents, educators, and caregivers to stay informed and vigilant about online safety.

Being safe online



## Key Concerns:

- Privacy Risks: Apps like TikTok and Roblox collect data and can expose children to strangers if privacy settings aren't properly managed.
- *Inappropriate Content*: Despite moderation efforts, some users may share or encounter inappropriate or harmful content.
- Online Interaction: Platforms encourage social interaction, but students can be vulnerable to cyberbullying, scams, and other negative behaviours.
- Screen Time: Excessive use may impact students' focus, sleep, and wellbeing.

Gaming apps like Roblox are popular among students, offering immersive and creative experiences. However, these platforms often include chat features and user-generated content, which require careful supervision to ensure safe and positive interactions.

## **Supervision Tips:**

- Set Clear Boundaries: Discuss and agree on appropriate screen time limits and types of apps students can use.
- *Use Parental Controls*: Many apps, including Roblox and TikTok, offer parental controls to restrict content and manage who can interact with your child.
- *Monitor Activity*: Regularly check in on what your child is doing online and encourage open conversations about their digital experiences.
- Educate About Online Safety: Teach students not to share personal information and to report any uncomfortable interactions.

#### Positive Behaviour for Learning focus – Weeks 3 and 4

Our focus for Weeks 3 and 4 is Digital Safety. We encourage all students to practise responsible online behaviour, stay safe when using digital platforms and seek help if they encounter anything concerning.

We advise parents and carers to maintain awareness of their child's online activity and support them in navigating digital spaces responsibly and safely.
