School Attendance – Every Day Matters.

As part of our commitment to ensuring that every student is ready to learn, we would like to emphasise the importance of **school attendance**. Regular attendance is crucial for academic success, and we aim to improve the number of students arriving at school ready to learn by 9 am.

It is important that your children attend school every day. It may not seem like much, but valuable learning time is lost when they are absent. This graphic highlights just how much time is lost. If your child is having 1 day away from school every fortnight it will equal 4 weeks absent in just one school year and 1 whole school year over the length of their school life.

If your child(ren) are absent for any reason it is your responsibility to inform the school. If we don't receive an explanation your child's teacher or a member of staff will be in contact with you. We will be vigilant in our approach to improving student attendance at John Warby PS.

We kindly remind parents that if you need to collect your children from school, please avoid doing so during our break times, which are from 11:00 am to 11:45 am and from 1:45 pm to 2:15 pm. Collecting students during these times can be challenging as they are on the playground, and we want to ensure a smooth transition for everyone.

The Resilience Project – Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness & Emotional Literacy

Our student learning in these areas will continue to grow during 2025 with a major focus on having Empathy and Kindness for each other. I have had many conversations with our students who are demonstrating knowledge and understanding of these crucial concepts. I love it when our students are able to explain to me examples of how they utilise these mindsets in their everyday life. I encourage all families to make these concepts regular discussion points at home. Please talk to your children and reinforce these positive mindsets with them. To assist your understanding of these crucial concepts and how you can play a part in developing these in your children I invite you to join me and members of our school staff to the after hours webinar/workshop "Building Resilience at Home" on Thursday 13th March 2025. Our student academic progress reports will also be available through the Parent Portal this year.
