Cathy Gorman will finish up in the Learning and Support Teacher role at the end of Term 2. P&C suggested to present something to her at assembly on Wednesday, Week 10, Term 2 followed by a celebration at a Staff Dinner on Thursday. Education Week: Week 3, Term 3- celebration on Wednesday- BBQ Lunch. Parent volunteers proves tricky with parents wanting to see classrooms- SLSOs to run BBQ but parents to help with prep. Fence: DoE are looking at installing a full size fence around the school. DoE have raised that we cannot enact lock out procedures at KVPS. Brad raised issue with the street scape with the design taking away from the heritage village. It was raised that in its current state, it does not provide the security for children that abscond. Brad raised a compromise with the full fencing starting at the carpark and continuing past the hall rather than along the street. It was agreed that we continue to challenge the need for a full fence until such time a student is enrolled that requires secure fencing.

Agenda Item	General Business
Notes	Sculptures in the Valley – Message from Meg: Starts Sept 5th. Would expect sculptures to be submitted a week before. Mrs Delemico thought it would be best to do in class groups and for the students to be given a clear project. We would submit all four works and then there is prize money for the winner, donated to the school. Option for people to buy the works. Will need at least three sessions during the afternoons to plan, make and finish works. Four would be better. It would be great to get a theme from the P&C. Meg has a timber fan, a metal gate and some wood we can donate. We've also got tiles but they may be heavy. Should we post in the newsletter informing families what the kids are making and if anyone has any recycled, reused materials lying around to donate. Colourful housepaints, wood pieces, non sharp metal etc. Materials should be durable as works will be displayed outside in the weather. P&C flagged that it would need to be specific materials to avoid unwanted and unused rubbish. Would be happy with parent volunteers – we can advertise for helping with hammering, screwing and to be happy for kids to hammer too. Presumably not using hand tools. Jen raised that there may be a miscommunication. Meg to meet with Jen, Camille and Kat to clear up miscommunication- refer to previous minutes.



Previous Minutes (04.04.2025): Jo Novich visits to discuss Sculptures in the Valley- On September 5-7, 13-14 two weekends- within walking distance of the village- to be held Corner of Upper River Road and Moss Vale Road. Indoor and outdoor sculptures, accessible to all. Price remains the same for children and families. Jo asks how our school could become involved in the sculptures. Fears that it has become too highbrow- food, music could be to blame. The committee wishes for it to become more accessible to locals, hence the change from the long weekend. **Discussion**: As a school, open to the idea of sculptures- prize money- age groups, collectively do something or as a class- or group of kids or individual competitions. Lock in exactly the categories. Trudie asked for a local artist to come in and work shop similar to Folk Fest singers come in. Jen said yes but will need to talk to teachers. Parameters around materials eg Recycled materials? Reusable to be repurposed- natural and recycled. Related to local area. Brad suggested an afternoon with the overcrowded curriculum. P&C could run it or if it could run during lunchtimes. P&C to look at an organiser, Angela and Camille to be approached to assist. Issues around number of sculptures if it is open for school and home- may end up with 80 sculptures. **Decision**: In Term 2 to create quality artworks- open to those interested- sculpture made up of multiple units put together to form one sculpture. Perhaps talk to Kat Bevispay Kat a casual day to create in one day. Not a prize, but one quality piece to submit. One day of sculpture making, theory and practical. Clarification on Sculpture: No clear criteria- artists send in a photo followed by judging and a winner is announced. Not craft eq vase or bowl. Final remarks from Jo: Considering volunteering for a couple of hours. Lots of different roles, including ticketing desk, showing areas and bonus! You get a t-shirt. Meg said she will be happy to be the P&C go to person. Thank you Jo for coming to talk to the P&C!

Flexischools- Set up and ready to go. Vicki said teachers are not to buy from this menu as it is discounted. Encouraged to order from full menu.

You're No Food Fool Book: Rosemary Stanton, KV local and nutritionist, showed Trudie a book aimed at children to make informed food choices. Beautiful book, Trudie asked if we could buy a copy for the Library.

Excursion Fee- Question asked if it covers all excursions. There are a number of families who do not pay. Operation funding covers those who do not pay for the excursion fee. It was raised that it may have slipped some parents minds. Thank you for adding on excursion notes how the cost is covered eg P&C, excursion fee etc.
