FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

WELCOME TO THE LAST NEWSLETTER FOR TERM 1...!

This term has certainly moved at a busy pace, with our school community working hard to ensure our students have fantastic opportunities for learning and personal growth.

### YEAR 7 - A GREAT START!

Thankyou, to all families, for supporting Year 7 on the beginning of their *high school journey*. Year 7 is a talented year group, who conduct themselves according to our values: 'Unity Knowledge Respect', most recently on the very successful Year 7 camp.

The camp is such an important activity for the students to develop teamwork, create trust relationships and to build resilience by stepping out of their comfort zones. ## YEARS 11 AND 12

#### **Updates on Senior Assessments**

Term 1 has been a busy term, especially with Year 11 beginning their Preliminary year for their HSC pathway, and Year 12 already half-way through their HSC year. The rigor of senior study is very different to the junior school and, for some students, the senior course can be a challenge.

Kariong Mountains High School has a detailed assessment policy in place to support senior students. A copy is available on our <u>website</u>. Both Years 11 and 12 were issued with these at the beginning of term. Some key points for students and parents to remember in relation to the Assessment policy:

All students are to sign for the assessment book and retain a hard copy.

**The Assessment Policy** is also found on the school website.

Misadventure: in the event of a major illness or problem occurring, students must see Mr White, DP, as soon as possible. The student MUST see the DP on their FIRST day back at school to apply for a misadventure and submit appropriate paperwork. A medical certificate or statutory declaration needs to be submitted with the paperwork for the task mark to be counted. Examples of the documentation needed are found in the Assessment policy.

**Technology glitches are not a valid reason** for misadventure. Students must be organised and have a backup plan of using a USB to back up their work and printing at school if the need arises.

**It is also a good idea** to map tasks on a calendar or organiser so that they have a visual reminder of what is needed for time planning.

Thank you, to our parent community for your ongoing support of this important process.

## ATTENDANCE UPDATE

As previously explained, KMHS is a focus school for improved attendance. To improve, this is certainly a team effort by all in our school community to commit to processes, understand requirements of attendance with the Department and to ensure, most importantly, that all students are engaging in valuable learning time by attending consistently.

I'm pleased to report that KMHS has shown significant improvement in the two terms that we have been involved in the focus group, with our overall attendance improving by 9.8% to date. Sustaining this improvement is vital for our students' learning success, so thank you to all parents and carers for your ongoing support and working with the school.

## DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

## Term 1, Week 10

Students are required to complete a number of assessment tasks in all subjects throughout the year. For students in Years 10 to 12 the rules for assessment submission are far more strict and explained in the policy and schedule booklets they signed for earlier in the term.

When students do not meet the requirements of an assessment task, for example, submitting it late or not all, they are issued with a 'N Warning Letter.' The letter provides details of the task and how the student can rectify the problem. Students are also required to demonstrate diligence to satisfactorily meet the requirements for each course. This includes attendance and completing class work. N Warning letters can also be issued for those not demonstrating diligence.

If students fail to meet the requirements of a course(s), they will be 'N Determined'. This means they will not be eligible for their RoSA in Year 10, Preliminary or HSC. Students in this position will have had support provided to them throughout the year, with several opportunities to redeem themselves.

#### **Positive Behaviour for Learning**

As part of PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning), we have a reward system that involves \$10 canteen vouchers. For each Week A, students in Years 7 to 9, who have positive memos on Compass for the term are entered into a draw. Their names appear on a spreadsheet with a random number generator used to select the lucky student. The same process occurs for students in Years 10 to 12 for Week B. The winners are advertised in each newsletter.

## CREATIVE THINKING WORKSHOPS



## Collaboration in Kariong Mountains Learning Community (KMLC)

Local primary school principals and our high school principal, Donna James, have been working together to create learning opportunities to engage and enrich Stages 2 and 3 students in working as a collective.

As Literacy Lead Teacher, I was thrilled to run a *Critical Thinking Challenge Workshop* on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> March and then offer a two-hour *Creative Thinking Workshop* on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> April, to stimulate new approaches to writing creatively.

To kick off Term 1, the two enrichment workshops focused on developing Stages 2 and 3 minds. **Both went off with a bang - in a good way!** 

By working together with our primary schools; Somersby, Central Mangrove, Peats Ridge, Kulnura and Kariong - also known as our *Primary Partner Schools* (PPS), we have seen how successful this collaboration is proving to be in inspiring a love of learning and working collectively. The proud looks on everyone's faces (the primary school kids, our Year 9 Literacy Leaders and our wonderful staff) at the end of the workshop said it all.

## Workshop 1: Critical and Creative Thinking Workshop

We had a new and exciting adventure this week. First thing in the morning, we packed up the car with all our props, clues, and technology, including four of our *Year 9 KMHS Literacy Leaders*, and headed out to a much more rural environment.

Students from Kulnura and Somersby made up the four groups, who spent all morning focused on 'escaping'.

## Sherlock Holmes 360° degree Virtual Escape Room

I dare you to escape from this room....

You have probably heard of the new craze in education and for socialising - 'Escape Rooms' - where you must overcome a series of puzzles, mysteries, and hurdles to escape with the answer at the end. The first workshop focused on critical thinking. Teams were each given a Year 9 expert, where they had 90 minutes to attempt to solve the mystery through focusing on each clue and using teamwork.

Students were intrigued by playing this fully immersive 360° Sherlock Holmes digital escape room. The experience helped students use their analytical skills while learning across age groups, with students from other schools and KMHS student leaders.

Engaging and fun, this interactive, immersive digital escape had students complete six challenges. These included analysing footprint evidence

(comparing shoe prints with the culprit's shoe print), decoding a Vigenère cipher, reading graphs, and analysing the interactive study of Sherlock Holmes in their quest to solve literacy-based challenges to finally escape the room.

Thank you, to Somersby Public School for sharing your lovely learning environment/library space with all of us! We were made to feel so welcome and appreciated by our PPS staff there, thank you.

All 16 local high schools were invited to nominate a Year 11 student.


The Kokoda Trail is a 96 km trek through the rugged Owen Stanley Range in Papua New Guinea, where Australian and Japanese forces

#### To all our Year 10 Parents and Carers

It is with regret that I am informing you that **Year 10** will not be going to the Gold Coast for the end-of-year excursion. An alternative option that will hopefully be closer and more cost-effective is currently being researched. Once an alternative option has been found and some indicative pricing has been established this information will be shared with all students, parents, and guardians.

A large deposit was requested by the service provider by a certain date and student deposits were required to help subsidise this large amount. The number of deposits made by students was not enough to secure the dates at the preferred accommodation. Alternative and cheaper accommodation was also sought, however, this too provided to be challenging and we were unable to secure anything that best met our school's requirements.

**Current deposits** will still be kept and held as credit for the new venue, once it has been confirmed.
