Well done, to our fantastic new cohort for 2023. Year 7 have begun the term with enthusiasm and such a positive attitude!!

A highlight for the school was the *Meet and Greet Year* 7 *BBQ* held last Wednesday. It was fantastic to see so many of our Year 7 students and their families come along and meet the staff.

A short survey will be e-mailed to Year 7 parents/ carers to seek feedback on the transition process, which I hope will inform improved practice for next year.

Kariong Mountains High School's transition program is a team effort and I want to acknowledge the support of: our *partner schools* (Kariong, Somersby, Central Mangrove, Kulnura and Peats Ridge primary schools), the tremendous *KMHS Student Services team*, our ever-enthusiastic *Mr Flakus* (Year Advisor) and our *parent/carer school community* for your support of Year 7. We look forward to working with you all in the journey ahead.



YEARS 11 AND 12

Term 1 has been a busy term, especially with Year 11 beginning their Preliminary year for their HSC pathway, and Year 12 already halfway through their HSC year. The rigour of senior study is very different to the junior school, and for some students, the senior course can be challenging.

Kariong Mountains High School has a detailed assessment policy in place to support senior students. A copy is available on our website. Year 12 were issued with their schedules at the beginning of Term 4 last year and Year 11 received theirs last week. Last week I presented to parents/carers and Year 11 students the NESA (NSW Education Standards Authority) requirements for their Stage 6 pathway.

Following, are key points for students and parents to remember in relation to the Assessment Policy:

- ► All students are to sign for the assessment book and retain a hard copy.
- ► Assessment policies in digital format can be accessed on the school website.
- ▶ Misadventure: in the event of a major illness or serious problem, the Deputy Principal, Mr White, must be advised as soon as possible. The student MUST see the DP on their FIRST day back at school, to apply for a misadventure and submit appropriate paperwork. A medical certificate or statutory declaration needs to be submitted with the paperwork for the task mark to be counted. Examples of required documentation can be found in the assessment policy booklet.
- ► Technology issues are not a valid reason for misadventure. Students are required to be organised and have a plan for using USBs to back-up their work and print at school if the need arises.
- ▶ Plan and organise Students are encouraged to map tasks on a calendar or organiser to have a visual reminder for time planning. Both assessment schedules include this organisation tool.

YEAR 10 ASSESSMENT BOOKLET

Year 10 Assessment Booklets will be distributed to students by the end of Week 5, when they will also be published on the <u>school website</u>. I ask parents to take the time to review this document with your son or daughter and use it as a planning tool. This process assists students with time management and will help prepare them for the rigours of assessment planning in their senior years. Please contact the Year Advisor, Mr Klempert, or our Deputy Principal, Mr White, should you have any queries.

ATTENDANCE

Critical to student success is consistent attendance in all years. It is recognised that all students, to meet course outcomes in subjects, should have an attendance of 95% or more during the school year. It is also a legal obligation of parents and carers to provide reasons for leave.

The school will send an SMS to parents should your child be absent.



Please ensure you follow up with an explained reason for your child's absence as soon as they return to school. This can be done via the parent portal in Compass or contacting the school via phone or email.

In addition, please remember that being late to school or leaving early can also affect attendance requirements under partial absences. The school is aware there are reasons this may occur, however, it is parent/carer responsibility to provide valid explanations for absences.

Mr McGlynn is the school's attendance officer. He will contact parents should students' absences indicate a pattern of leave without explanation.

Please do not hesitate to contact the Deputy Principal or Year Advisor for your child, to discuss prolonged absences if required.

NAPLAN 2023

Understanding Online Assessment

The following information is sourced from the <u>NAPLAN website</u>, where you can find more information.

NAPLAN online tests include a range of question formats and interactive features. Students answer questions by clicking, typing and dragging; some questions include audio or interactive tools; all questions can be reviewed and answered, flagged and returned to later. The assessments can run through a real-time internet connection or onscreen without an internet connection.

Assessment Tools

Adjustments for students with disability include *audio* and *visual* alternative format questions to assist students with disability to access and complete online NAPLAN assessment.

Keyboard Shortcuts - can be used to navigate and interact with the online assessment questions.

Audio - headphones are required for some questions that include sound in the spelling, writing and numeracy tests.

Timer - a timer on the screen (can be hidden) shows the time allocated for the test - and displays a warning during the last five minutes.

Numeracy tools - some numeracy questions include access to online tools (ruler, protractor or calculator.

Zoom tool - a magnifying glass icon, located in the top left-hand corner of the screen, enables students to enlarge the view to 150, 200 or 300%.

Progress Summary - can be accessed via the grid icon, which displays questions that have been answered, unanswered, unread or flagged.

Public Demonstration Site Tests

In advance of taking NAPLAN, students are encouraged to explore the <u>Public demonstration site tests</u> for their year level in order to familiarise themselves with the different item types as well as the features of the test player. Students with disability, their teachers and families can use the public demonstration site to see some of the adjustments available and check the compatibility of assistive technology.



Pop Up Podcast

KMHS students made the most of the weather (which was fabulous), while taking part in the Pop Up Podcast workshop, held at the school in Week 3.

Students and staff learnt how to write, produce, host and edit their own podcasts.
















The photos above show Year 12 VET Construction students honing their tiling skills. Their planned approach and attention to detail ensured fabulous results for the whole team!

Upcoming P&C Meeting


