SENIOR PATHWAYS INFORMATION EVENING 14/6/2023

Year 10 will be entering an important phase of their schooling with the *Senior Pathways Information evenings* being presented this term. These evenings provide crucial information needed by students and parents to make informed decisions for subject selections in Years 11 and 12. Information on the nights will include:

Variations in HSC pathways

NESA requirements for alternate pathways

Transition to Stage 6 - what's involved.

It is an expectation that all Year 10 students attend the information evening to understand the selection process and requirements for a Stage 6 pathway. Students will also receive the subject selection booklet at this evening.

Interviews will be conducted with all Year 10 students on Friday 16/6/2023 to discuss the suitability of their chosen pattern. Further information will be distributed closer to the date by Mr Hipwell.



** STARS ASSEMBLY **

Recognising student achievement is an integral part of our school's high expectations and success. STARS Assemblies are held in Terms 2 and 4 to recognise students, who consistently apply themselves and are achieving to the best of their potential.

Our Term 2 STARS Assembly will be held on *Thursday* **25**th *May*. Parents of students receiving awards will receive a letter of invite in Week 3 or 4.

NSW CURRICULUM REFORM

A complete overhaul of the NSW Educational Curriculum is currently underway and the release of the new syllabi that drive this curriculum has started this year. The process of a total overhaul will take many years to be completed, requiring schools to redevelop every teaching and learning program – a significant task and complex planning is required.



Each syllabus has specific content and specialised focuses and all are structured with common threads that guide the changes. There are three core elements that underpin the directions of every subject syllabus:

 A FOCUS ON DEEP LEARNING – Teaching and learning is focused on developing students' deep knowledge of important concepts, principles and methods on each subject. Factual and procedural knowledge remain essential, but the syllabi of the new curriculum prioritise depth rather than breadth of learning.

INTEGRATION OF KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS

– Learning in each subject is a mix of theory and application, with no subject focused only on knowledge or only on skills. New syllabi develop skills in applying knowledge (for example, critical and creative thinking) and provide opportunities for students to develop and demonstrate such skills.

PROGRESS IS BASED ON ATTAINMENT

- The new syllabuses are untimed. They do not specify when every student must commence, or how long they must learn, each syllabus. Students' progress to the next syllabus once they understand the prior syllabus. Students, who require more time can have it; students ready to advance are able to do so.

Implementation of all new syllabi will be a five-year process. All staff are undertaking significant professional learning with planned time to prepare them for each subject's implementation phase. Whilst a challenge, staff are embracing the new focus and look forward to the learning opportunities they will provide our students.

Lastly, I'd like to use this opportunity to inform the school community of my official appointment, in the holidays, to the principal role here at Kariong Mountains High School.

I am excited and grateful to have been given this opportunity and I look forward to a long and successful partnership between the school and our learning community of families and partner schools.

I am looking at building on our expectations from Term 1, with our continued emphases on uniform compliance and respect. Thank you, to our supportive parents, previously and in the future, in addressing these important areas of our school.

STARS Awards

STARS awards are back for Term 2. STARS recognises students, who consistently apply themselves with diligence to their studies. The criteria to be awarded a STARS certificate is as follows:

- Attendance above 90% (explained).
- Consistent application in attempting all tasks to the best of their ability.
- Consistent positive attitude to learning.
- 90% completion of homework where applicable (Years 7-10).
- No N-Warning letters (Years 11 -12).
- <=3 negative Compass entries (uniform excluded).</p>

Students in Years 7-10 need 4 nominations while students in Years 11 and 12 require 3 nominations.

As stated earlier in the newsletter, our Term 2 STARS Assembly will take place on Thursday 25th May. The families of recipients will be informed beforehand with further details.
