

Promoting Peace with the Rotary Club

One of the first official duties for our new Student Leadership Team was hosting our annual Peace Pole Ceremony with Rotary Club members to mark the UN's International Day of Peace on Tuesday. In 2021, Rotary donated 100 Peace Poles donated to 100 schools across the country to mark the centenary of Rotary in Australia. Our Peace Pole was donated by the Rotary Club of Upper Blue Mountains Sunrise and planted in the garden along the walkway to the entrance of the main building.

The Peace Pole initiative began in 1955 after the Second World War. Now, more than 250,000 Peace Poles stand in over 200 countries around the globe, symbolising the common wish for a world at peace.

Our Peace Pole is marked with the message "May Peace Prevail on Earth" in four languages: English, Dharug, Gundungurra and Samoan. Each year we gather with Rotary to reaffirm our commitment to Peace.


Art on Display in Japan





The Royal Aero Club of New South Wales is located at Camden Airport in Sydney's south-west. They are the Southern Hemisphere's largest not-for-profit volunteer-run flight training organisation and have a unique focus on upskilling young people for future careers in aviation.

Twice a year, they host a 'Try and Fly Weekend,' inviting individuals of all ages and backgrounds to experience the thrill of aviation firsthand. This event includes a one-on-one Trial Introductory Flight with a Flight Instructor, an airside tour of Camden Airport, career talks about the various pathways in aviation and a BBQ lunch.

BLUE MOUNTAINS WRITERS FESTIVAL SCHOOLS PROGRAM

Presented by Varuna, the National Writers' House, with support from the Blue Mountains City Council Safe to Be campaign.

In the lead up to the 2025 Blue Mountains Writers' Festival, 8 exciting writers will be visiting Blue Mountains public high schools to talk expression, respect, identity, the power of story, and building careers and community through writing.

The Blue Mountains Writers' Festival team has curated three 45-minute sessions which schools can offer to any cohort of students.

SESSION 1 | EXPRESS YOURSELF







Experience the power of poetry and performance with **Emilie Zoey Baker** (slam poet), **Nick Solo** (Hip Hop artist with background teaching poetry to young people) and **Vivian Pham** (a writer and poet who published her first novel at 19). In this session, students will hear about how our panel use carefully chosen words to express their experiences and emottons, and how they tell stories about the world through their chosen artform. Includes readings/performances.

Emilie Zoey Baker is an award-winning poet and performer who has toured nationally and internationally. She was a Fellow at the State Library of Victoria, poet-in-residence at Museums Victoria, and the winner of the Berlin international Poetry Slam. She teaches slam poetry in schools around the world and is the founder and creative director of OutLoud, Australian Poetry's Victorian youth slam competition.

Nick Solo is an artist, poet and songwriter best known for his work as the frontman of Hip Hop outfit Horrorshow. Over the course of a 15-year career, he has released seven studio albums via legendary Sydneybased label Elefant Traks, sold out countless tours and collaborated with some of the biggest names in Australian music.

Vivian Pham is a Vietnamese novelist, essayist, and poet from southwestern Sydney. Her novel *The Coconut Children* was published in 2020 by Penguin Random House, which won the Matt Richell Award for New Writer of the Year and the SMH Best Young Australian Novelist Award. She is a course director and key tutor for Faber Writing Academy's Writing a Novel course, and is currently adapting *The Coconut Children* for stage with Belvoir

SESSION 2 | POWER OF STORY




What does it mean to write – and read – about people like you? Join Nevo Zisin (storyteller, writer, poet and educator); Jasmin McGaughey (author Young Adult fiction, and Ash Bartys Little Ash Series); and Jumaana Abdu (winner of the 2017 What Matters? Competition, now a published author, who was shortlisted for the prestigious Stella Prize in 2025) for this session about the incredible power of storytelling to build empathy and develop our understanding of the world around us.

Nevo Zisin is a storyteller, poet, TEDx speaker, educator on transgender topics, workshop facilitator and awardwinning author of Finding Nevo and The Pronoun Lowdown, a useful guidebook on all things related to pronouns. They have been in-conversation with Queer Bye's Jonathan Van Ness, Transparent producer Zackary Drucker and world-lamous spoken-word poet and activist Alok Vaid-Menon.

Jasmin McGaughey is a Torres Strait Islander and African American writer and editor. She is the author of the Little Ash series presented by Ash Barty and illustrated by Jade Goodwin. In 2023, Jasmin won a Queensland Premier's Young Publishers and Writers Award. She has written for Overland, Kill Your Darlings, SBS Voices and Griffith Review and recently co-edited Words to Sing the World Alive. Her debut YA, Moonlight and Dust, was published in July 2025.

Jumaana Abdu is the author of Translations, which was shortlisted for the Stella Prize, the MUD Literary Prize, and a NSW Premier's Literary Award. She was named Sydney Morning Herold Best Young Novelist in 2025 and her widely published fiction and essays have won the Dal Stivens Award, the Patricia Hackett Prize and the Phoebe Journal fiction prize. During the day, she is a medical doctor.

SESSION 3 | FROM THE MOUNTAINS TO THE WORLD: COMMUNITY AND CAREERS



Get inspired! You CAN make a living drawing illustrations and writing stories! The creative industries is in the top 5 employing sectors in the Blue Mountains, and we have more creatives living here than in many regions in Australia. Join Blue Mountains locals Tegan Bennett Daylight (author and teacher) and Bill Hope (artist and illustrator) for a session about creative community and creative careers.

Tegan Bennett Daylight is a writer, teacher and critic whose books include novels, short stories, essays on writing and reading, as well as fiction for children and young adults. Tegan's YA novel Royals was shortlisted for the NSW Premier's Award for Young People's Literature. How to Survive 1984, a stand-alone YA novel and sequel to Royals was published this year with a third and final book in the Royals series in the works.

Bill Hope accidentally drew himself into existence with a crayon at an early age and has been drawing ever since. Today he is an artist and illustrator living in the Blue Mountains. Bill has published a number of books for hidren and held a series of solo exhibitions, and is also the illustrator for the YOU & ME series with Andy Griffiths.
