



# Guma Dancers perform in Springwood



# **Community Liaison News**

#### TRAFFIC SAFETY ON THE WAY TO AND FROM SCHOOL

We are continuing to work with Blue Mountains City Council to improve safety for our children as they come to and from school.

As you are aware, the Council have installed improved signage and crossing markings on Merriwa St at the front of the school, and have provided short-term Council traffic supervisors to assist at the crossing for the duration of the diversion of traffic from Lurline St (this traffic diversion is expected to finish by the end of March).

The Ada St "Kiss & Drop" zone is available in the morning to assist you with dropping children off, and avoids the busyness of Merriwa St.



The Council have provided us with the updated details of the school zone offences and corresponding fines.

We ask that all parents and carers also reinforce and model safe behaviours when out and about with your children. Transport NSW have some useful tips about talking to children about road safety.

#### HELPING OUT AT SCHOOL

There are lots of ways that you can get involved and help out at school ... not only does your help mean we can offer even more opportunities to our kids, but it also shows your child that you value their education and their school, and it strengthens that very important relationship between home and school.

You can help with Breakfast Club each morning, or Sushi Fridays (once or twice a term),

help at our Garden Working Bees, help cover books in the library, help in the uniform shop, help with fundraising or events such as the Welcome BBQ, and you can come to P&C meetings. We LOVE our volunteers!

# SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES WHAT ARE **YOU** RISKING?\*





Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need **YOU** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.



#### No Parking

You have 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.





#### No Stopping

You are not permitted to stop on a length of road with a no stopping sign.





#### **Bus Zone**

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus.





#### Mobile Phone Use

Do not use a hand held mobile phone while driving.





#### School Zone Speeding Offences

40kmph is the speed limit. Children are vulnerable in school zones.



#### Pedestrian Crossings

Do not stop or park on or near a marked crossing.



#### Driveways

Do not stop on or across a driveway.



#### Intersections

Do not stop on or within 20 metres of an intersection.

PENALTY \$544 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

#### Parallel Parking

Must parallel park in direction of travel unless signpost states otherwise. PENALTY \$410 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

#### **Double Parking**

Do not double park in a school zone.

PENALTY \$410 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

#### Footpath and Nature Strip

Do not stop on a footpath, nature strip or obstruct ramp or path access.



\*Fines are current as of September 2024. Fines and demerit points are subject to change.
