Class News: Xanthic and Celadon's Out-of-This-World Science Space Adventure!

Xanthic and Celadon blasted off into a world of wonder last week with an exciting excursion to the Science Space Centre — and what a day it was! From fiery bubbles to dinosaur fossils, our curious young scientists were immersed in hands-on learning, discovery, and awe-inspiring fun.

One of the most jaw-dropping moments? Watching bubbles catch on fire and seal smoky liquid nitrogen gas inside their shiny surfaces — then bend into cube shapes! It was science meets magic, and our students were captivated.

The action didn't stop there. In the STEM challenge zone, teams raced the clock in a LEGO engineering challenge, building clever creations under pressure — and learning a whole lot about collaboration and problem-solving along the way.

Next stop: the Planetarium, where students lay back and experienced the night sky like never before. With zero light pollution, they were able to clearly see galaxies, constellations, and even the swirling arms of the Milky Way. A truly unforgettable moment!

In the Science Museum, the learning continued with interactive exhibits that kept minds and hands busy. Students:

- * Landed a virtual space rocket
- * Explored hydraulics and cogs
- * Wrote with light
- * Investigated how air moves and bends objects
- * Measured ball throws using radar devices
- * Looked through microscopes at incredible tiny specimens
- * Pieced together dinosaur fossils and controlled robotic dinos
- * Witnessed how tornadoes are formed and so much more!

It was a day packed with curiosity, creativity, and excitement. Xanthic and Celadon came away buzzing with new knowledge, deeper questions, and a renewed love for all things science.




















Class News: Tangerine
