

# **Getting Ready for Learning**

iPad offers children fun and exciting ways to interact, learn and create. You know your child best, so we've created a list of features to help your family stay safe and productive with iPad.



### **Digital Safety**

You can know and feel good about what your kids are doing by setting up built-in parental controls.



#### With Parental Controls you can:

- Decide who can talk to your child with Communication Limits
- Protect them from what they see and send with Communication Safety
- Select apps to allow at all times with Always Allow
- Keep app and website content age appropriate with Content Restrictions



## Protect kids from what they see and send



If your child receives or sends photos or videos that might contain nudity, Communication Safety warns them, gives them options to stay safe and provides helpful resources.

- On your child's device go to Settings and tap Screen Time
- 2. Tap Communication Safety
- 3. Turn on Communication Safety



## Set up Parental Controls on your child's device




- On your child's device go to Settings and tap Screen Time
- 2. Tap Lock Screen Time Settings
- Set up a passcode to Lock Screen Time Settings so your child can't change them (do not share the passcode with your child)
- 4. Set-up Communication and Content Restrictions

# Decide who can talk to your child





Follow the steps to choose contacts to allow and limit



## Select apps and features to allow or turn off



You can turn apps or features such as FaceTime or News off, removing them from the Home Screen.

# Choose what they view and prevent explicit content



With Content Restrictions, you can customise age settings for websites, music, news, games and more. Select an age range or rating, or restrict websites and apps altogether.

### **Support and Focus**

Screen Time makes it easy to see what your child is doing and guide them towards healthy screen habits.



#### With Screen Time you can:

- Keep track of how your child is using the device with Screen Time data
- Set time limits for categories of apps, or individual websites and apps with App Limits
- Use Downtime to schedule time away from screens
- Customise how the device is use






- On your child's device go to Settings and tap Screen Time
- 2. A Daily Average of device usage is displayed
- 3. Tap See All App & Website Activity, to see device usage for today or the week
- 4. Scroll to see the Most Used apps and websites
- 5. Scroll further to see how many Pick-Ups of the iPad occur throughout a day (and when)

## Schedule time away from screens



With Downtime you can set a specific time away from screens, like dinnertime or bedtime. You can also choose which apps are accessible or off limits

- On your child's device go to Settings and tap Screen Time
- 2. Tap Downtime then Scheduled
- 3. Choose Everyday or Customise Days
- 4. Select when your child will have restricted access to apps and features



# Set daily time limits on apps



Set time limits for categories of apps, like gaming, or individual websites and apps.

**Note:** Avoid limiting apps or websites needed for school.

## Protect your child's hearing



By turning on Reduce Loud Audio, the device will automatically reduce loud sounds to a safe decibel level.

### Manage from your iPhone

If you're a parent or guardian with an Apple device, you can manage your child's iPad from your own device.



#### With Family Sharing you can:

- Approve what kids buy or download with Ask to Buy
- Share locations and find devices with the Find My app
- Set up a child's device with your preferred Parental Controls
- Share Apple subscriptions and purchases





- 1. Go to Settings, tap your Name
- 2. Tap Family, then tap Set Up Your Family
- 3. If your child doesn't have an Apple Account, tap Create Child Account. But if your child already has an Apple Account, tap Invite Others and follow the prompts
- 4. On your child's device, accept the invitation

## Approve what your child buys with Ask to Buy



When your child wants to download an app or make a purchase, they send a request through Ask to Buy and you can approve or decline it from your device.



Follow the steps to set up Ask to Buy

Check your child is in a safe place and find lost devices



Sharing locations with your family enables you to see your child's device location in Find My. After sharing your locations, family members can help locate a missing device.

Follow the steps to set up location sharing in the Find My app

Get notified when your child arrives



You can get automatic notifications when a family member arrives at or leaves a particular place (like school or home).



Follow the steps to set up notifications in the Find My app

Share purchases and subscriptions



With Family Sharing, purchased apps, media, books and subscriptions can be shared with your child at no extra cost. No need to buy an app multiple times for each child.
