Mrs Higgins Principal's Message

Hello families and students,

This week I wish to address a concerning issue for our school which is road safety. We are aware of the concerns our parents and community have over the crossing outside our school gates. We have witnessed ourselves the reckless and careless driving that is threatening to our student safety. As a school we are raising our concerns with Tamworth City Council in the hope to have a wombat crossing installed and a review to be completed on our need for a crossing guard. Unfortunately, school staff are not permitted to cross students on the road. I wish to thank one of our parents, Mrs Proctor, who is relentlessly pursuing this matter in support as well. She has started a petition for action to be taken so if you wish to sign, please feel free to show your support. Additionally, if you have an incident while crossing the road, please let the school know so that we can add it to our register.

While this matter will take time to pursue, I strongly encourage parents to discuss road safety with their child, as we have done, and will continue to do, at school. Things to discuss would be:

- Where to cross the road e.g. at crossings, not behind vehicles, not in front of buses
- Visibility why we use a crossing, why cars cannot see small children
- How to cross waiting to ensure vehicles have stopped and seen you, not running across

As adults of our community, I encourage you to also display these road safety practices so that our students can follow your example.

On the matter of safety, it has been alarming the number of students that ride scooters and bikes to school without a helmet. These are a vital piece of head wear that protect our students from brain injuries. As stated on Transport NSW: Bicycle riders must wear an approved helmet securely fitted and fastened. This includes children on bikes with training wheels and any child being carried as a passenger or in a bicycle trailer. Research shows helmets can reduce serious head injuries by about 70% and reduce fatal head injuries by 65%.

Please remind your child to wear the correct protective wear when riding to and from school and to push their bikes across the road.

On a positive note, I wish to congratulate our students who attended the North West Swimming carnival on Monday. While we do not have anyone continuing to state, each student's effort in the pool, sportsmanship and representing Kootingal with pride are to be congratulated. Well done, we are all so proud of you.



We have nominated to participate in CAPERS this year. CAPERS is a regional art production that displays music, dance and drama performances by students from Kindergarten to Year 12. As a school we participate in the small schools' dance item.

An expression of interest form will be coming home shortly to indicate if your child would like to participate. As the dates of CAPERS performance clashed with our Stage 3 excursion, we have worked hard to successfully move these dates. This will allow our Stage 3 students the opportunity to participate if they wish. Stage 2 excursion dates will remain the same. Stage 3 excursion will now take place on Monday 10th November – Wednesday 12th November 2025.

We are offering a wonderful range of opportunities for our students this year. Our students are participating in the Premier's Public Speaking competition, Stage 3 students will be attending a debating workshop, and we are supporting students as they enter individual competitions at the Tamworth Eisteddfod. With World of Maths Day just around the corner, please don't forget to submit your payment. We have our whole school cross country (fun run for Infants) on Thursday April 10th with the P&C holding a sausage sizzle and having treats available to purchase. This was moved from the Wednesday to coincide with primary sport and staff availability. On the last Friday April 11th, we will be holding our school ANZAC service at the Cenotaph at 10am. We warmly welcome our parents and community to attend these events. I truly appreciate the hard work and dedication of our teachers in creating these valuable opportunities for our students.
