Attendance

What does KPS do to support attendance?

Kootingal Public School has a set procedure when a student is absent. Each day, Kootingal Public School sends a text message to the parent/carer of an absent student. This text message is from a dedicated number. As a result, you can trust this message is from Kootingal Public School. It is best to save this number in your phone.

When a parent/carer replies to the absence text message, it will be coded according to the NSW Department of Education *School Attendance* policy. If a response is not received from the parent/carer, Kootingal Public School will send another text message at the start of the following week. A parent/carer has seven (7) days to explain an absence.

Kootingal Public School has a Learning and Support Team. At this fortnightly meeting, an attendance report is given by the Principal. It includes students of concern, students below the 85% attendance rate, students currently on the Home School Liaison Officer's caseload, attendance patterns causing concern and progress on attendance initiatives. When a student is highlighted as having an attendance pattern or rate that is of concern, this is marked in Sentral on the class roll. This assists to remind classroom teachers to monitor the attendance patterns of their students.

It is important to note that Kootingal Public School takes attendance very seriously.
