










#### K/6M Vegetable Market

experiences in our next newsletter. Thank you to Miss Merrett, Miss Booby, and our parents who have helped prepare the students for their events.



#### **Attendance - Procedures for Lateness**

#### **Unsatisfactory Patterns of Attendance**

Parents are responsible for the regular attendance of students at school. However, what do schools do if a student has an unsatisfactory pattern of attendance?


A child is considered to have an unsatisfactory school attendance when they have:

- regular absences without explanation (despite follow-up from the school)
- regular absences and explanations provided by parents are not accepted by the principal, or
- extended periods of absence without an explanation or the explanation is not accepted by the principal. An extended period of absence may be consecutive or irregular patterns of non-attendance.

The most common issue for schools is the patterns of nonattendance. Days off for shopping, birthdays, an early appointment in town, can't get organised in the morning etc are not valid reasons for absenteeism from school.

It is important to ensure there is a consistent pattern of attendance as this allows for continuity for the students both socially and academically at school. It is very difficult to assist students reach their full potential if they are not at school.


