

How to brush:


Move soft toothbrush in circles over teeth and gums

- One entry per person / per section with a maximum size of 100cm x 80cm.
- All entries MUST BE READY TO HANG (for example: with D rings and cord).
- All entries must be delivered to the Bentley Public Hall on Thursday 31st July 2025 between 9am to 4pm or Friday 1st August between 8am to 9am. No works will be accepted if delivered after 9am Friday 1st August.
- All winners will be notified by phone after the judging on Friday 1st August 2025 and invited to receive their prize on Saturday 2nd August 2025 at 1pm.
- All artworks must be collected between 2pm to 5pm Sunday 3rd August 2025. If the artwork
 is unable to be collected by this time, a representative will be at the hall on Monday 4th
 August 2025 between 4pm to 6pm. Uncollected artwork will be surrendered and disposed
 of at the discretion of the Bentley Hall Committee.
- The Bentley Hall Committee reserves the right to have any entries reproduced in the press.
 Should any dispute arise for which no specific rule is laid down, the matter shall be referenced to the Bentley Hall Committee whose decision is final.
