This term saw the completion of the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check. The screening check is completed by all Year 1 students in NSW Public Schools. I am very excited to announce that Lake Illawarra South's results are above the state average.

Over the next term, our school website will be migrating to the new Department format. This requires considerable work behind the scenes to ensure all information is accurate and up to date. We appreciate your patience during this transition and will advise you when the new website is live, as it will offer improved navigation and access to important resources for parents.

KINDERGARTEN 2026

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2026 are now being accepted. Applications for siblings of currently enrolled students can be submitted for consideration by the non-local enrolment panel. If you are a local enrolment, you are able to enrol online or call in to the school office and collect an Enrolment Pack. If you are applying to enrol a sibling of a current non-local student, you will need to call the school office to register your child and collect the required enrolment form for completion. If you do not live within the Lake Illawarra South Public School catchment area, you are welcome to submit a non-local enrolment application for consideration by our enrolment panel.

ATTENDANCE

Arriving at school on time is essential for starting the day positively and setting the tone for successful learning. When students arrive promptly, they have the opportunity to settle in, organise their materials and engage fully in the day's lessons from the very beginning. Being on time also demonstrates respect for teachers and classmates, helps develop important life skills like punctuality and responsibility and reduces disruptions in the classroom. We encourage all students to make punctuality a priority to support their academic growth and contribute to a productive and respectful school environment.

NSW public schools have an attendance target of 95%.

There were 92 students with 100% attendance for the fortnight of Weeks 8 and 9.

This is the attendance data for the last fortnight broken down into year groups:

Year 5: 79%

Year 6: 92%

Well done to the following groups: Year 4 girls with an attendance rate of 98% for the last fortnight. Year 6 boys had an attendance rate of 96%. Both Year 2 and Year 3 boys had an attendance rate of 97%.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school approach designed to promote positive behaviour, improve student engagement, and create a safe and supportive learning environment. It encourages students to develop essential social and emotional skills that help them succeed both in and out of the classroom. Each fortnight, PBL focuses on a specific value or behaviour to guide students in making positive choices.

The focus for this week is Respect – Allow others to learn. At our school, respect is a key part of creating a positive and supportive learning environment. One important way we show respect is by allowing others to learn. This means listening carefully, following classroom expectations and being aware of how our actions affect those around us. When students focus on giving their full attention and creating space for others to share, we build a calm and productive classroom where everyone has the chance to succeed.

Allowing others to learn also means being patient and understanding that everyone progresses at their own pace. It involves using kind words, waiting for your turn to speak and avoiding distractions that could disrupt learning. By practising respect in this way, we foster a school community where all students feel valued, supported, and encouraged to do their best.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club takes place every morning in the library starting at 8:10am, providing students with a welcoming space to enjoy a nutritious meal before the school day begins. This program is free of charge, ensuring that all students have access to a healthy breakfast. Our Breakfast Club is proudly supported by FoodBank Australia and Bakers' Delight, whose generous contributions help us provide fresh and wholesome food options. By offering this program, we aim to promote student wellbeing, improve concentration and energy levels, and create a positive start to each day for our school community.

CHAPLAIN NEWS

Our chaplain, Mrs Kahlia Devall, is available on site every Wednesday and Friday to provide valuable support to students and their families, focusing on their overall wellbeing. Ms Kahlia plays an important role in fostering a positive and caring school environment by offering a listening ear, guidance and practical assistance to students who may be facing challenges, whether emotional, social or personal. She works collaboratively with staff and families to ensure that students feel supported and safe, helping them build resilience and develop coping strategies.
