ATTENDANCE

Across the school, 550 learning days were lost in the first five weeks of this term.

Attending school regularly is crucial for a child's academic, social and emotional development, laying the foundation for lifelong learning and success. Consistent attendance allows students to engage fully with the curriculum. Beyond academics, school provides a unique social setting where children develop important interpersonal skills such as communication, collaboration and empathy by interacting with their peers. Regular attendance helps students build relationships, develop a sense of belonging and improve their confidence and self-esteem. Moreover, attending school daily promotes routines, responsibility and discipline, which are valuable life skills.

NSW public schools have an attendance target of 95%.

Congratulations to the 100 students who had 100% attendance over the last fortnight. An additional 31 students had attendance over 90% for the fortnight.

52 students across the school have an attendance rate of 95% or higher for this term.

This is the attendance data for the last fortnight broken down into year groups:

Well done to Year 3 girls, Year 2 boys and Year 6 boys – 96% attendance for the last fortnight.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school approach designed to promote positive behaviour, improve student engagement, and create a safe and supportive learning environment. It encourages students to develop essential social and emotional skills that help them succeed both in and out of the classroom. Each fortnight, PBL focuses on a specific value or behaviour to guide students in making positive choices.

This week the focus on Responsibility – Be a problem solver continues. This focus encourages students to actively and thoughtfully address challenges they encounter, both in their learning and in social situations at school. Being a problem solver means looking for constructive ways to overcome difficulties rather than giving up or reacting negatively.

Students are taught to identify what the problem is, think through possible solutions, and choose the best course of action. This might involve seeking help from a teacher or friend, breaking a big problem into smaller steps or considering how their choices might affect others. By practising problem-solving skills, students learn to stay calm when faced with challenges, take responsibility for their actions and work cooperatively with others to find solutions.

This PBL focus helps students build resilience, confidence, and independence. It also supports a positive classroom environment, where everyone feels empowered to overcome obstacles and contribute to making the school a respectful and responsible place for all.

LAWARRA

Next week the focus shifts to Safety - Keep your hands and feet to yourself. This expectation fosters safe, respectful, and supportive school environment. It is essential in helping students understand personal boundaries importance of respecting others' physical space to prevent accidents, conflicts and feelings of discomfort. Teaching this behaviour begins with clearly explaining the expectation in simple, ageappropriate language so that all students can grasp why it matters. Staff model appropriate behaviour by demonstrating how to keep hands and feet to oneself during classroom activities, transitions and play. Positive reinforcement is also a key component; when students demonstrate they can keep their hands and feet to themselves, they receive praise or rewards, which motivates them to continue making safe choices.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club takes place every morning in the library starting at 8:10am, providing students with a welcoming space to enjoy a nutritious meal before the school day begins. This program is free of charge, ensuring that all students have access to a healthy breakfast. Our Breakfast Club is proudly supported by FoodBank Australia and Bakers' Delight, whose generous contributions help us provide fresh and wholesome food options. By offering this program, we aim to promote student wellbeing, improve concentration and energy levels, and create a positive start to each day for our school community.

CHAPLAIN NEWS

Our chaplain, Mrs Kahlia Devall, is available on site every Wednesday and Friday to provide valuable support to students and their families, focusing on their overall wellbeing. Ms Kahlia plays an important role in fostering a positive and caring school environment by offering a listening ear, guidance and practical assistance to students facing who may be challenges, whether emotional, social or personal. She collaboratively with staff and families to ensure that students feel supported and safe, helping them build resilience and develop coping strategies.
