KINDERGARTEN 2026

The school is currently finalising the schedule for Kinder Orientation for those students commencing big school in 2026. If you know of a family who is in area and has not yet enrolled their child, please encourage them to contact the school as soon as possible.

STUDENT MOVEMENT IN 2026

If you know that your child will not be at Lake Illawarra South PS (excluding current Yr 6) in 2026, please let the office know in writing as soon as

possible as this helps our forward planning. We often get queries about how the process works at the beginning of the school year and why we sometimes have to wait a few days to form classes. This is often due to us not knowing student movements, so your early response would be invaluable. If you are going to be away at the beginning of the 2026 school year, we will need to know in writing so a place can be held in a class.

PLACEMENT OF STUDENTS 2026

The staff of Lake Illawarra South Public School collaboratively work together to make decisions about the placement of students in their next year's group. During this time, many varied considerations are taken into account to ensure the best mix for each class. If you have a particular request for placement of your child or children based on a significant learning need, it is asked that you submit a letter to Mrs Simula (marked Confidential) at the office by 2:40pm Friday 7th November. Please note that requests for particular teachers, although flattering are not appropriate.

All requests must be submitted to the office only. Please include your child's name, current class, request and reason for request. Requests will be for the year 2026 only.

All requests will be considered but there is no guarantee that requests can be met, as there are many contributing factors in preparing class lists.

Please note that teachers do move class/placement at times, including staff currently on RFF and specialised programs.

The school is not able to ensure that your child will have the same teacher for the entire year because of staffing constraints and personal factors relating to individual teachers.

Please be reassured that all classes are structured to provide the best possible outcomes for students both academically and socially. Decisions about student placement are made using a wide range of information gathered throughout the year.

Requests will not be considered at the beginning of Term 1 in the following year unless the principal considers there are mitigating circumstances. Generally, class structures cannot be finalised until the total school enrolments are known in the following year. It is with professionalism that staff

consider class structures, which are formed in the best interests of all students and the school.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school approach designed to promote positive behaviour, improve student engagement, and create a safe and supportive learning environment. It encourages students to develop essential social and emotional skills that help them succeed both in and out of the classroom. Each fortnight, PBL focuses on a specific value or behaviour to guide students in making positive choices.

This week, our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) focus is Safety – Allow personal space and privacy. We are encouraging all students to respect the personal boundaries of others by giving them

enough physical space and acknowledging their right to privacy. This helps create a safe and comfortable environment where everyone feels valued and respected. By practising this important social skill, our students are learning empathy, consideration, and how to build positive relationships with their peers and staff.

Next week our focus shifts to Respect – Accept others' differences and opinions. We are encouraging students to embrace diversity by recognising and valuing the unique backgrounds, ideas, and perspectives of everyone in our school community. By fostering an environment of understanding and open-mindedness, we help build stronger, more inclusive relationships where every voice is heard and respected. This focus supports our commitment to creating a welcoming and supportive school culture where all students feel safe and valued.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club takes place every morning in the library starting at 8:10am, providing students with a welcoming space to enjoy a nutritious meal before the school day begins. This program is free of charge, ensuring that all students have access to a healthy breakfast. Our Breakfast Club is proudly supported by FoodBank Australia and Bakers' Delight, whose generous contributions help us provide fresh and wholesome food options. By offering this program, we aim to promote student wellbeing, improve concentration and energy levels, and create a positive start to each day for our school community.

SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY

Many of our students walk home in the afternoon. For the safety of everyone, we ask parents and carers to please remind children of these points when crossing the road:

- ·STOP back from the kerb
- ·LOOK in all directions
- · LISTEN for traffic
- •THINK about when it is safe to cross

Please encourage your child to use the crossings located on Reddall Parade and Pur Pur Avenue. Crossing the road between parked cars is not recommended for children. The potential for danger of being hit by a car whilst crossing between parked cars is enormous. Drivers cannot always see pedestrians (particularly small children) waiting to cross the road.

Double parking is unfortunately also a problem that places the lives of our students at unnecessary risk. Double-parked vehicles are visual obstructions for young children trying to cross to the other side of the road. They also place children getting in or out of the car at risk, as they must venture to the middle of the road to do so. Please refrain from double parking around our school and use the other safer parking options available to you. Please also avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and three point turns.
