

We are committed to providing a professional service to everyone we work with and in return we ask that our staff is treated with respect.

School gates

The school gates are locked from 9:30am - 2:50pm.

If your require entry to the school site and the gates are locked call the school office and a member of staff will come to assist.

Car park access

The school car park is only to be used for the drop off and pick up of students currently attending our preschool, inclusive education unit, or who have mobility difficulties.

The car park is not to be used for parking during school assemblies/events with exception for visitors with mobility difficulties.

Sentral Parent Portal

Our school uses Sentral Parent Portal to monitor student absences. When your child is absent, you will receive a notification through the app. Using this app has many advantages

- -You can notify the school instantly when your child is absent
- -You can notify the school of future, planned absences such as doctors' appointments
- -Cut down on paper notes being sent home by the school which can be lost or damaged and take longer to respond to.

A letter with an access key will be provided to you once enrolment is complete, there is a different access key for each parent/carer.

School Bytes

Our school has implemented a system called School Bytes to manage payments. Parents/carers can visit the School Bytes portal at any time to make a payment online, view payment history and apply credit. For non-student payments, please contact the school for a payment link.



<u>Step 1: Question - What is our favourite Juice?</u>

Step 2: Collect the information - We tasted the juice and made our decision.









Step 3: Display the data - We chose either an apple or an orange picture and put it in the correct line.







Step 4: Interpret - What did we notice? The students noted that the apple juice line was longer and the orange juice line was shorter. They decided that this meant that apple was the favourite as more people had chosen the apple picture. They also noted that the difference was 4 votes and 6 people still liked orange juice the best..
