- Makes Learning Easier! When everyone's in the right spot, learning is way more fun!


Here's how to nail "Right Place, Right Time":



The Albatrosses have had an amazing start to the year, learning and working hard.
















# K Apacas

Even in Stage 3 hands on Mathematics is very important and a lot of fun.
















In 5/6 Dingoes, we have been learning about decimals using money, like buying tickets to a concert for example. We have been playing games using place value charts and number cards.

Students take turns to draw a card from the deck and then have to decide which place value we assign that number. The goal is to make the largest number possible using the cards you get. Some people were working with numbers up to 7-digits!














3/6 Feathertail Gliders sitting in rows learning how to use grid books for Mathematics. The students thought it was like being at high school and they look forward to the next lesson.


