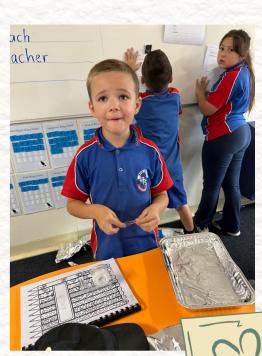








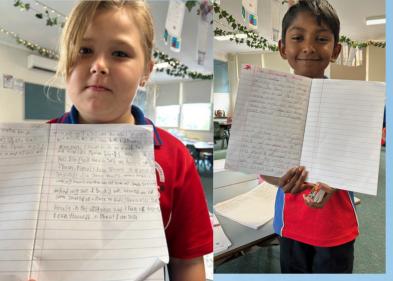




Black Swans 2025

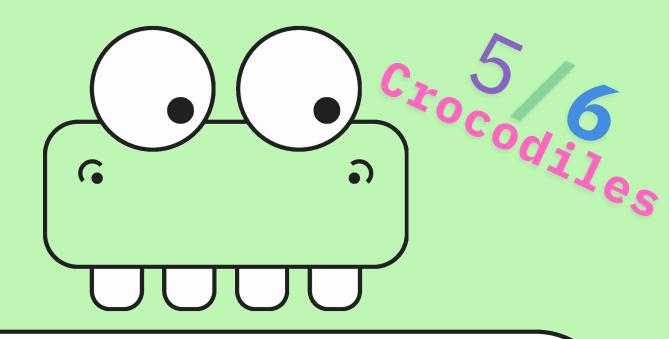

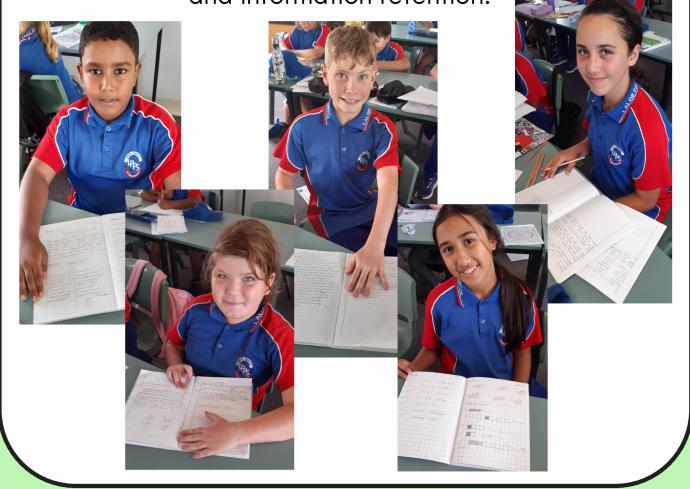
In Mathematics, we have been completing addition and subtraction activities and stretching our brains to remember our timestables.

- Food colouring (optional)

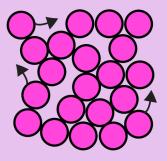
Instructions

Solid or Liquid?



A solid is a state of matter with a fixed shape and volume. Its particles are tightly packed, so they don't flow or change shape easily.



A liquid is a state of matter that has a definite volume but takes the shape of its container. It flows easily, allowing it to adapt to the shape of any container it is in.

The question remains, is goop a liquid or a solid? Try making this at home - feel free to upload some photos to your google classroom!

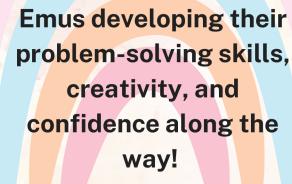

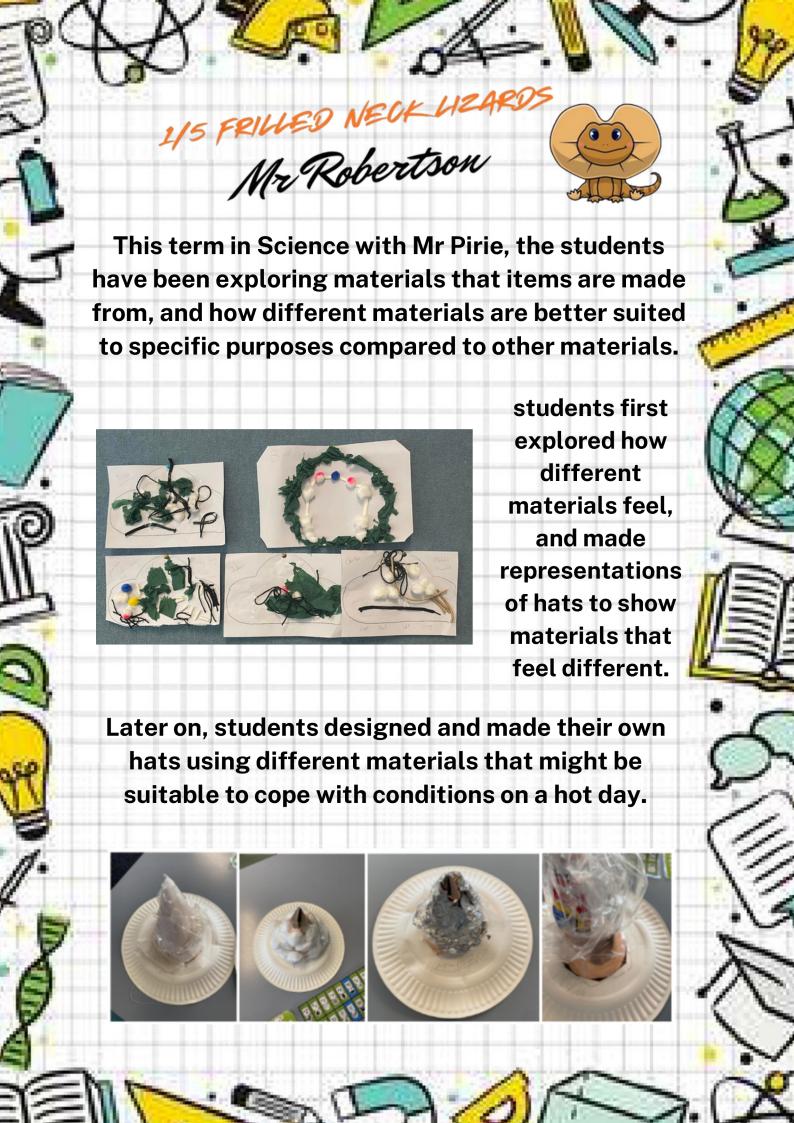

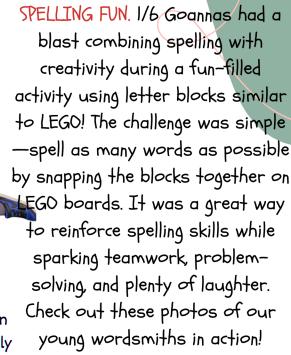

At Lalor Park Our Kindy's Get the Best Start!



Best Start Kindergarten Assessments identify student literacy and numeracy skills on entry to Kindergarten. All Kindergarten students complete the literacy and numeracy assessment in the first 5 weeks of school. It has been conducted in all NSW public schools since 2010.

Congratulations to all of our Kindergarten students who have completed their Best Start assessments. All parents have been given their reports and the Best Start are now working hard to utilise the data to plan for learning that teachers are now working individual needs of each student.



The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9, focussing on reading, writing, numeracy and language conventions. NAPLAN results allow parents/carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time, and can assist teachers by providing additional information to support their professional judgement about students' levels of literacy and numeracy attainment and progress. We will now await the results, and will notify parents when they should be expected to be distributed.

Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT) are conducted throughout the year with a focus on Reading, Mathematics and Spelling.

These tests establish what students are capable of, then challenge them at the appropriate level for effective learning.

By conducting these tests in Semester 1, and then again in Semester 2, teachers can monitor student progress across the year within the three domains.

High Potential & Gifted Education

High potential students are those whose potential exceeds that of students of the same age in one or more domains. Their potential may be assessed as beyond the average range across any domain. They may benefit from an enriched or extended curriculum and learning opportunities beyond the typical level of students the same age

What is the Premier's Sporting Challenge?

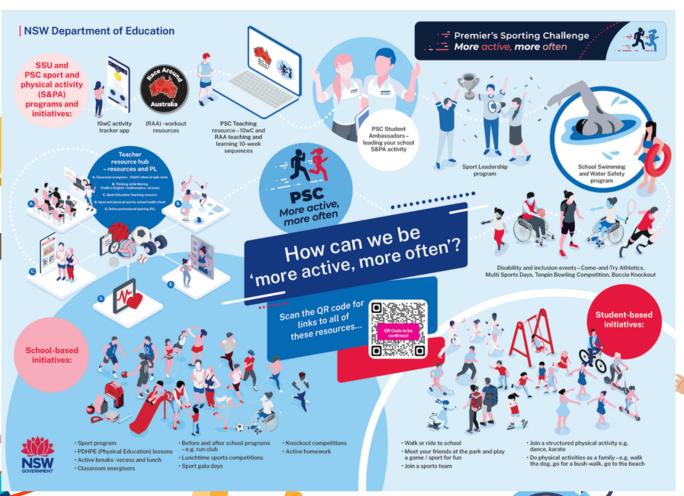

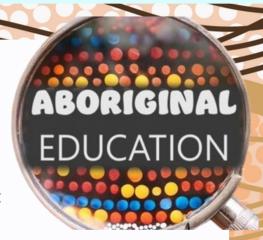
Keep an eye out for information regarding enrolments for Kindergarten and Preschool 2026.

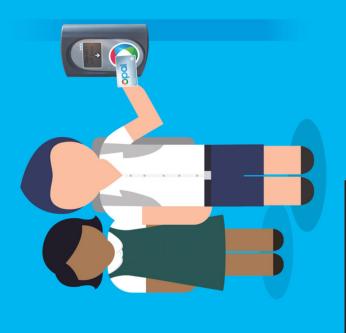
