

#### **School gates**

The school gates are locked from 9:30am - 2:50pm.

If you require entry to the school site and the gates are locked, call the school office and a member of staff will come to assist. If your child is arriving late or leaving early they must sign in at the front office. They will receive a sign in/out note to take home.



#### **Sentral Parent Portal**

Our school uses Sentral Parent Portal to monitor student absences. When your child is absent, you will receive a notification through the app. Using this app has many advantages

- -You can notify the school instantly when your child is absent
- -You can notify the school of future, planned absences such as doctors' appointments
- -Cut down on paper notes being sent home by the school which can be lost or damaged and take longer to respond to.

A letter with an access key will be provided to you once enrolment is complete, there is a different access key for each parent/carer.

#### **School Bytes**

Our school has implemented a system called School Bytes to manage payments. Parents/carers can visit the School Bytes portal at any time to make a payment online, view payment history and apply credit. For non-student payments, please contact the school for a payment link.




# PRESCHOOL READING PROGRAM



The Budgies are working hard learning and improving their reading and writing skills in reading groups.








# 1/2 Bilbies

Great work, Currawongs!






















# 5/6 Crocodiles






5/6 Dingoes performed our assembly item in Week 2!




## Goannas' Heartfelt Words for Mother's Day

# Road Safety Initiative: Focus on Pedestrian Safety

As part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety of all students, we are excited to announce a new focus on pedestrian safety around our school. With the aim of promoting safe walking practices for students coming to and from school, we will be introducing a special initiative that rewards safe behaviour. 'Safe Walking' certificates will handed out each week during the morning COLA assemblies. The class that earns the most certificates by Week 8 will win a pizza party!

We understand that students use different ways to get to and from school. All students can earn a certificate for showing Safe Walking, no matter how they arrive or leave the school grounds.

Here are some examples of what Safe Walking looks like:

- From the car park: Holding an adult's hand from the car or taxi until you reach the school gate.
- From the car on the street: Getting out of the car on the footpath side and walking safely to the gate.
- Walking: Looking both ways before crossing the road, holding an adult's hand or walking right beside them when crossing, using the pedestrian crossing, and waiting for the green man to appear on the traffic lights before crossing safely.

By following these safe practices, students can earn their Safe Walking certificates and help keep everyone safe!

# Road safety

### Walking safely together to and from school

Walking to and from school is a great way to spend time with your child and encourage safe and

healthy behaviours.

Here are a few tips to help keep your child safer as a pedestrian:

Plan, practise and talk with your child about

being alert in the road environment.

- Until your child is at least 8 years old, always hold their hand, as they can be easily distracted. Children need your help to spot dangers.
- Then, up until at least 10 years old, supervise your child very closely, and hold their hand when crossing the road.
- Always use pedestrian crossings where possible.
- Meet your child near the school gate.
   Never call them from across the road.
- Explain why the places you have chosen to cross are the safest. Talk to them about why they should stop, look, listen, think before crossing a driveway, road or car park.

Children learn safe road user habits from you and will continue them when they are old enough to travel alone.
