
# NO PARKING







# <u>Measurement</u>



In Science, the Budgies are learning about pull and push forces and how gravity is a force that pulls objects towards the Earth.












The crazy colour, a colour no one has ever seen. What colour could it be? We all wondered.

# S/GDOOGGS SCIENCE



This term, 5/6 Dingoes have been exploring forces! We've had great fun with some hands-on science.

In our 'Feather and Ball Drop' (using a ball and balloon), students saw gravity in action and discussed how air resistance affects falling objects. Watching a video of the experiment without air was a real eye-opener for many!

# Flying Foxes



# 1/5 FRILLED NECK UZARDS Mr Robertson

Over the last two weeks of learning, we have been exploring using the right unit of measurement for specific uses. Along with this, we explored if we halve a regular shape (like a square piece of toast) equally down the middle to share between two people, would each person get more, less, or the same if we halved the toast diagonally instead? The students then explored halving shapes equally down the middle and diagonally to solve puzzles in a game called 'Pienado' on the iPad.

It's not too late to start! Let's keep the reading fun going at school and home.




