- Log in to the app.
- Use the access keys provided by your school to add your children to the app. Access keys can be added in the Settings menu.
  - You will then see the Home Screen.
- View the QuickStart guide.
- You're now ready to use the app.



# What is the School Bytes Parent Portal?

The School Bytes Parent Portal offers convenience and flexibility, allowing you to:

- Make online school payments, including payments for multiple siblings, simultaneously.
  - Use a family credit to pay for an activity or school contributions.
- Download payment receipts.
- View all historical payments in one place.
- Complete and submit digital permission notes.
- . View the status of all permission notes.
  - Request a refund if necessary.
- Push notifications to keep parents updated with what is happening at school you can view notes sent home on your phone.

This service can be accessible at your convenience at any time, day or night.

Through the Parent Portal, you can easily download a receipt once a payment has been made and have access to view all historical payments when needed. Online payments are processed in real time and can be viewed by school staff immediately.

A key feature is the addition of push notifications. Notification are alerts or short messages that we can send to your mobile device. A push notification arrives on your home screen or, as a notification within the School Bytes app. Please make sure you have the notifications on in settings.




# Father's Day Stall




Did you know that patterns can grow and shrink? We made patterns using blocks!

We have been learning about different types of patterns and creating our own.






















This week, the Budgies are learning about different ways we can communicate. In this lesson, we were trying to crack a code using Braille, a language used to help people who have little or no vision to read.

#### The Braille Alphabet



Braille is a tactile writing system for people who are blind or have low vision. It uses raised dot patterns arranged in 2x3 cells to represent letters, numbers, punctuation, and words, allowing reading and writing through touch.

### Science Discovery: Investigating Plants Up Close

This term in Science, students have been exploring the different parts of plants through close-up photography. Using magnified images, we challenged ourselves to find and identify the flower, stems, leaf, and roots.

Afterwards, students enjoyed drawing and labelling each part themselves, building both their observation and scientific skills!


# 1/5 FRILLED NECK LIZARDS Mr Robertson


