

Recalled children's sand due to asbestos

Dear parents and carers,

The ACCC has issued recall notices for educational sand products used in our school as they may contain tremolite asbestos (a naturally occurring asbestos).

The health, safety and wellbeing of students and staff are our highest priorities. All measures have been taken to immediately remove these sand products from our classrooms and school areas.

Importantly, the ACCC reports respiratory asbestos has not been detected in any of the tested samples. The release of respiratory asbestos fibres from the sand is unlikely to occur in its current state, unless the sand is processed by mechanical means such as crushing or pulverising.

If your child has brought any brightly coloured sand home from school, including as part of artwork, please place the sand in a heavy-duty plastic bag, double tape it securely and keep it out of reach of children.
