
PRINCIPAL REPORT

School Representation Agreement Update

The School Representation Agreement has been reviewed and updated. Please see the updated section below which provides more clarity around attendance and behaviour expectations regarding being eligible to represent the school.

School Representation Agreement

This document outlines expectations for students to maintain eligibility to participate in extracurricular school related activities. Representing Leeton High School is a privilege earned by our students who embody our school values, and the expectations associated with being respectful, responsible, learners. Students demonstrate these values through their learning, attendance, and adherence to school policies, procedures, and expectations. We believe it is important to set high expectations for our students in relation to academic effort, attendance, uniform and behaviour to ensure that every student has the best chance of success.

School representation includes any activity where the student represents the school. Examples include student leadership, inter-school sport including representative sport, performances, work experience, and excursions. Extra-curricular activities may also fall under this category and include any activity that is additional to the core curriculum being delivered. Examples include, but are not limited to, special school endorsed events in and out of school time, camps, additional courses, specialised excursions which do not relate to the direct delivery of curriculum programs.

Students may be considered ineligible to participate in extra-curricular activities and/or represent Leeton High School if they do not meet the school's high expectations in the areas of:

Area	Expectation	Not eligible
Attendance	Minimum attendance of 85%	Attendance below 85% (explained absences considered)
Truancy	Attend all lessons	Three or more incidents of unexplained/unauthorised class absence within a term (including arriving late to class or leaving without explanation or permission)
Academics	Actively participate in learning Completing and submitting assessment tasks on time	Failure to complete/submit assessment tasks by the due date in Stage 4, 5 and 6 (Illness/Misadventure considered). Unresolved N Awards for Stage 5 and Stage 6 students
Behaviour	Follows School Rules: Be a respectful, responsible, learner	On Level 1 at the time of the event For 5 weeks after a Formal Caution has been issued For 10 weeks after a Suspension has been imposed
Dress Code	Regularly wears correct school uniform	Failure to wear correct school uniform without explanation. Students must supply the office with a note from their parent/carer before Period 1 to explain why they are out of uniform. Note: our student welfare system can assist in the purchase of our endorsed school uniform for those in need.
