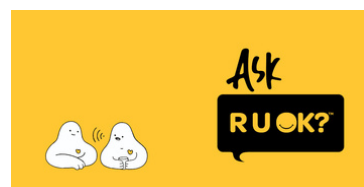
SistaSpeak

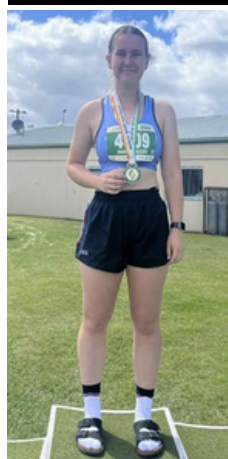
Proud and Deadly Awards 2025
