

NSW Behaviour Code For Students

NSW BEHAVIOUR CODE FOR STUDENTS

At our school, we are committed to fostering a safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environment for every student. A key part of achieving this is ensuring that all students follow the NSW Behaviour Code for Students. This code is designed to guide positive behaviour, promote respect for others, and support a community where everyone feels valued and safe.

It is important to remind all students and families that the Behaviour Code explicitly prohibits any form of racist comments or conduct. Racism has no place in our school community. Such behaviour not only harms individuals but also undermines the respectful culture we work hard to create.

Students who do not follow the Behaviour Code, including making racist comments, will face consequences in line with our school's consequences pathway. These may include warnings, loss of privileges, or more serious actions depending on the severity and frequency of the behaviour. Our goal is always to educate and support students to make positive choices, but we must also ensure that unacceptable behaviour is addressed promptly and appropriately.

We ask all members of our school community to work together in upholding these standards, so that every student can learn in a safe and respectful environment.

Check-in Assessment

Yr 3 - 6 Check-in Assessment

In the next few weeks, our school will be doing Check-in Assessments with students from Year 3-6. These assessments in reading and maths (and Writing Year 6) help teachers see how your child is doing. The results help teachers understand what your child needs to learn next and how to best support them. These tests are quick and are not used for report cards. They are just a way to help your child improve. Please encourage your child and let them know these assessments are nothing to worry about. We appreciate your support in helping your child to learn and grow.

NSW Behaviour Code for Students

NSW Department of Education

Behaviour code for students

Information for students and parents or carers

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected, to the best of their ability, to:

- show respect to other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- · strive for the highest standards in learning
- act in a courteous and respectful way that makes all members of the school community feel valued, included and supported
- · resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code
- attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- · respect all property
- be safe and not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, vapes, e-cigarettes or tobacco into our schools
- not bully, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against anyone in our schools.

Schools take action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high-quality teaching and learning.

All students have a right to:

- safety at school
- · access and fully participate in their learning
- be treated with respect by other students, teachers and school staff
- express their views, set goals and self-advocate.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments and apply an appropriate action when students are not meeting these expectations.

The department is responsible for the provision of a policy framework and resources such as legal issues bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment.

In this context, the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

Behaviour code for students: Student actions

Promoting the inclusion, learning, wellbeing, and safety of all students in NSW public schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches across a range of settings to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

To meet the expectations set out above, students in NSW public schools, to the best of their ability, should adhere to the following principles.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- · Communicate and behave courteously.
- Act and work cooperatively with other students, teachers, and school staff.
- Develop positive and respectful relationships.
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others.
- · Respect the learning needs of other students.
- Dress appropriately by wearing the agreed school uniform or dress code.
- Take care with school property and the property of staff and other students.



NSW Behaviour Code for Students Cont.....

Safety

- Model and follow school and class rules and expectations around behaviour and conduct.
- · Negotiate and resolve conflict.
- Be aware of and take responsibility for how their behaviour and actions impact others.
- Care for self and others.
- Be safe and help others to make safe choices that do not hurt themselves or others.

Engagement

- · Arrive at school and class on time.
- Be prepared for every lesson.
- Actively participate in learning.
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning.
