## Principal's Message

Welcome to Week 7!

It has been a pleasure to attend school every day to the sight of our students enjoying school life in general. If you happen to be at school during morning, recess and lunch time, you will hear a variety of tunes playing over our speaker, while our students play vigorously in their chosen activity. From hula-hooping and ribbon twirling, to limbering through the playground equipment, or participating in epic soccer matches, our students are having a good time. The student's enjoyment on the playing fields is also evident in their engagement in the classrooms. Both Infants and Primary are fully immersed in their learning and are displaying all the attributes that an educator takes great delight in seeing. They are humming along in an exciting fashion, and we are so inspired to be on this learning journey together.

We have many exciting events coming up this term, including a whole-school excursion to Young. We will view a variety of local art exhibitions as part of the Hilltops Off the Beaten Track Art and Cultural Trail. While our Primary students will be heading to Canberra in the last week of Term 3, our Infants have been invited to attend a Canberra excurision with our combined Young Small Schools in Week 2 of Term 3. Excitingly, our Stage 3 students will be attending the Transitions Small School Creative Arts 3-day camp in Murrambateman also in Week 2 of Term 3.

One of our critical events of the school year, is parent/teacher interviews. We have scheduled Wednesday 19th March for this year's first meetings. The aim of these is to share with you the progress of your child across a variety of areas in their learning and for you to share with us ambitions that you have for your child during their primary schooling. It is a relaxed and open meeting, whereby we can plan together ways that may better assist your child set a few achievalbe

short-term goals. Then, we will ensure that your child receives tailored support from teachers, our School Learning and Support Officer, and our Learning and Support Team. We envisage that this will have a positive and lasting impact on your child's self-esteem and engagement in school.

## **Chocolate Fundraiser**



The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.



NAPLAN will take place from Week 8, Wednesday 12 March to Monday 24 March 2025.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling.
