Over the past few weeks, the Year 9 and 10 girls and boys attended an "Anti-bullying Camp" Oakhampton, Split Rock Dam. Ready with their cold weather gear the girls arrived last Monday morning. Isobel and Athena delivered a consolidated Rock Water program, promoting relationships, self-awareness and building resilience and self-confidence over the two day camp. Mr Galloway introduced photography as a mindfulness strategy, focusing on the now, capturing that still frame of everything that is around you at that point in time. With various other activities, the girls built a large bonfire, cooked home-made pizza's in camp ovens and had a rich out of school learning experience.



On Wednesday of last week, the group of boys armed with warm sleeping bags, hiking shoes and a can-do attitude arrived happy and excited to be in an outdoor learning environment. With Mr Van Doesburg taking the lead, they learnt various life skills like catering for large numbers, managing their time and, like the girls, a consolidated Rock and Water program with Isobel. While also becoming one with their environment, camouflaging themselves into the scrub around them, avoiding Mr Galloway's ever buzzing drone attack (capture the flag, human vs tech)... The boys dined in style, cooking up mash potato in the camp ovens and enjoying freshly smoked pork ribs. "Best ribs I've ever tasted" was one of our food critics comments (Tyler Barrett).


