Principal Report

It has been wonderful welcoming our 2026 kindergarten students and their families to our school over the past two weeks. Our teachers have been extremely impressed with how settled the children were exploring the activities in the classrooms. Our Year 6 student leaders also did a fantastic job taking new families on a guided tour of the school. Congratulations and thank you to Harry, Henrietta, Ruby, Alex, Bella, Evie, Will and Deakin. Next Tuesday is our third and final Orientation Day, with new families treated to a morning tea hosted by our fabulous P&C as well as a performance from our Strings group.

In construction news, it is great that our Stage I classes have been able to move back into their original rooms. Next week, these classrooms will be carpeted, meaning each class may be relocated for one day. I/2S will be carpeted on Tuesday, I/2K on Thursday and I/2H on Friday. The library and EALD room will get new carpet during the school holidays. New library furniture also arrived at school today. I will also be meeting with the team that will be completing the A Block student bathrooms on Wednesday to set a timetable for when this work can be undertaken.

Selective High School & Opportunity Classes

Applications for selective high school and opportunity class entry in 2027 will be open from 6 November 2025 to 20 February 2026. Applications can be made: Apply here

For opportunity class placement, parents and carers need to apply when their child is in Year 3 (or when their child is in year 4 up until the end of Week 3, Term 1).

For selective high school placement, parents and carers need to apply when their child is in Year 5 (or when their child is in year 6 up until the end of Week 3, Term 1).

The placement tests will be computer-based and are held in May. Most test centres will be local high schools. Some primary schools may be required to act as test centres. Only one test is held on each test day. A student will only be required to sit the placement test on one day.


