Planning for 2026 Enrolments

Planning for 2026 is underway and it is critical that we receive information to assist us in this process. If you are aware that your child/ren will not be returning to MPS next year, can you please notify the office as soon as possible. Once again, this year we are hoping to be able to trial students in 2026 classes midway through next term. However, we need accurate information to form potential classes based on enrolments.



Applications are now being accepted for Kindergarten 2026. If your child turns 5 before July 31, 2026 they are eligible to start school next year. To help with our planning, it will be greatly appreciated if you can submit your application as soon as possible.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to <u>enrol online</u>. The online enrolment portal also accepts out-of-area applications. Out-of-area applications will be considered and decisions made as soon as possible.

If you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available from the front office, or you can download it from the <u>Department's site</u>.

School Upgrade

We have been informed that planned work around the school will commence on Monday 8 September. The replacement of the heritage roof in D Block (housing YMCA and Stage 1 classrooms) will begin late this term, with work expected to take a minimum of 8 weeks to complete. This will mean that our Stage 1 classes will need to be relocated to other areas within the school while work is taking place. YMCA will be able to operate as per usual, but access routes will change. The car park will be closed until renovations have been completed while the oval will not be able to be accessed by students while work is carried out.


Some areas within the school will also be carpeted, including the library, Stage 1 classrooms, Kindy classrooms, the EALD room and 3/4W. The mess hut area outside the kindy classrooms will get new flooring and the A Block toilets will also be upgraded.

Colour Blind Awareness Day - September 6th

Did you know that 1 in every 12 boys is living with colour vision deficiency? That equates to almost one in every class at school. Colour Blind Awareness Day is an opportunity to celebrate and raise awareness of people with colour vision deficiency. The date was chosen because it's the birthday of John Dalton, the scientist who first studied people viewing colours differently. See the flyer attached for more information.

COLOUR VISION DEFICIENCY

People who have a colour vision deficiency have difficulty seeing some colours or see them differently from other people. In the most common form of colour vision deficiency, people cannot see the red and green components of colours. They see most colours as shades of murky yellows and blues as often confuse colours with red or green in them.



COLOUR BLINDNESS VS COLOUR VISION DEFICIENCY






In the past, colour vision deficiency has been referred to as colour blindness. The term colour blindness does not accurately represent the condition as affected people still do see some colours. It does not affect the quality of vision.

GENETICS AND FREQUENCY


Colour vision deficiency is one of the world's most common genetic (inherited) conditions, which means it is usually passed down from your parents. It is found in 8% of males and 0.5% of females. That equates to 1 in every 12 boys.





IDENTIFICATION

Does your child often confuse colours? Can they identify the numbers inside the circles on the left and right? Ishihara tests are used to identify colour vision deficiency. Your GP or optometrist can confirm a colour vision deficiency diagnosis.



INFORMING THE SCHOOL

If your child's teacher is aware of a colour vision deficiency, they can make adjustments to their teaching to accommodate for your child's learning needs. If you are aware of colour vision deficiency in your child, please inform the school as soon as possible.

Upcoming Assessments

Over the next few weeks, our students will participate in a range of assessments. The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a short assessment that tells teachers how students are progressing in phonics.

The check takes 5–7 minutes and is carried out in the classroom by classroom teachers with each student individually. Results are available immediately. Teachers analyse the results and, if necessary, plan for any additional support that students might require by targeting teaching aligned with NSW English syllabus outcomes. The check complements existing strategies to identify students' progress in developing foundational literacy skills.

Our students in Years 3-6 will also complete the annual check-in assessment for all students in NSW Public Schools. All students complete a reading and a numeracy test of approximately 50 questions each. Year 6 students also complete a writing assessment. These assessments support the identification of students' performance in literacy and numeracy and inform next steps in teaching and learning.

Social Media

It has been interesting to see the Government introduce legislation to ban children from accessing social media by the end of this year. There is a slew of data that shows more young people are becoming more anxious, depressed and lonely than their parents and grandparents.

At our school, like most others, we are increasingly finding students arriving at school having been threatened, intimidated, harassed or humiliated online. We strongly encourage all parents and carers to monitor their children's online usage closely.

The eSafety Commissioner offers the following advice to students feeling the impacts of cyberbullying:

- Get help from a trusted adult or call Kids Helpline
- Get help from the police if you are in immediate serious danger
- Try not to say anything back it could make things worse
- Keep evidence take screenshots if you need to report it
- Report to the game or app
- Report to eSafety
- Block the person to stop them from contacting you


