Principal Report



Musical Costumes

Year 5	Our Year 5 students will be playing two different roles - the students and the villagers, and will need to bring their costumes from home. For the student role, we're asking them to wear their school uniform (blue school shirt, blue school shorts, white socks, and black shoes). For the villager role, they will also need jeans and a plain shirt. This might mean raiding your wardrobe or even popping into an op shop to find suitable pieces.

Planning for 2026 Enrolments

Planning for 2026 is underway and it is critical that we receive information to assist us in this process. If you are aware that your child/ren will not be returning to MPS next year, can you please notify the office as soon as possible. Once again, this year we are hoping to be able to trial students in 2026 classes midway through next term. However, we need accurate information to form potential classes based on enrolments.



Applications are now being accepted for Kindergarten 2026. If your child turns 5 before July 31, 2026 they are eligible to start school next year. To help with our planning, it will be greatly appreciated if you can submit your application as soon as possible.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to <u>enrol online</u>. The online enrolment portal also accepts out-of-area applications. Out-of-area applications will be considered and decisions made as soon as possible.

If you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available from the front office, or you can download it from the <u>Department's site</u>.

Premier's Reading Challenge Closing Soon

The closing date of the Premier's Reading Challenge is fast approaching! Make sure you read your books and record them online by Friday 19 September.

K-2 students have been completing the challenge in Library lessons and in class. 3-6 students are responsible for entering books into their own online reading record on the PRC website. Students can also access the website directly from their student portal.

Note that many new books have been added to the booklist. You can find the updated list on the <u>Booklists page</u> of the PRC website.

Upcoming Assessments

Over the next few weeks, our students will participate in a range of assessments. The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a short assessment that tells teachers how students are progressing in phonics.

The check takes 5–7 minutes and is carried out in the classroom by classroom teachers with each student individually. Results are available immediately. Teachers analyse the results and, if necessary, plan for any additional support that students might require by targeting teaching aligned with NSW English syllabus outcomes. The check complements existing strategies to identify students' progress in developing foundational literacy skills.

Our students in Years 3-6 will also complete the annual check-in assessment for all students in NSW Public Schools. All students complete a reading and a numeracy test of approximately 50 questions each. Year 6 students also complete a writing assessment. These assessments support the identification of students' performance in literacy and numeracy and inform next steps in teaching and learning.


