




Class Spotlight

Check-in Assessment Results

Late last term, all students in Years 3-6 completed the Check-in Assessment for Reading and Numeracy (Year 6 also completed a writing assessment). These assessments support the identification of students' performance in literacy and numeracy and inform next steps in teaching and learning. The school achieved extremely pleasing results, above the State average in all assessments. Congratulations to all our students! We are still waiting for the writing results to be published.

Public Speaking Competition Finalists


