## 2024 HSC results and High Achievers Ceremony (full program attached in the newsletter)

Examining the results from 2024 revealed that:

- We had and enrolment of 180 students. 40 courses examined and 875 examinations sat.
- 32 ATARs above 85 including 24 above 90.
- 91 band 6 results for 37 students across 68% of courses examined. Just over 10% of all student results were a score of 90 or more.
- 264 band 5 results across 88% of courses examined
- 40% of all results achieved were either band 5 or 6. Well above state average.
- 50% of courses examined achieved no bands 1-2 which are the bottom 2 band results
- 53% of course examined were above state mean
- 83% of courses examined achieve more bands 4-6 than bands 1-3
- 32 students achieve 10 units at band 5 or 6 level
- 2 students were placed on the allrounders list having achieved band 6 in 10 units – Jemma Richardson and Rhiana Zreik.
- First in state Mischa Davies (English Studies)
- 3rd in State Rachel Chen (Chinese Beg)
- Rankings, Menai is the 2nd ranked Comprehensive public school in the Shire/St George area and top 25 in the state in this category. 187th overall across the state against all schools. 2nd best rankings since 2018 (behind 2023 ranking of 149th)
- MHS was also recognised by DoE as a high value-added school for yr9 NAPLAN to yr12 HSC results. One of only 20 schools across the state to achieve this standard.
- New SBSMP School Behaviour Support and Management Plan

For 2025 all DoE schools were required to write and implement a school specific document on student behaviour management. All DoE schools were provided with the same template but needed to development the document for the school's context. This document is designed to further support and strengthen the DoE revised student behaviour policy which came into play in 2024. The overview of our SBSMP is:

Menai High School strives to provide quality teaching and learning opportunities for all studenthrough equity, inclusivity and excellence. Our goal is to equip students with the ability to be skilled learners who are skilled citizens and skilled in building pathways for life-long learning. This will be achieved through developing student agency and consistent teaching and learning practices across the school. Students can achieve their potential in an environment that is supportive, inclusive and equitable including high-level differentiation through actively building partnerships within the school community to support student learning and wellbeing. In achieving excellence, our teachers will embed high level teaching strategies that differentiate the curriculum for all students.

The plan is available for parents/caregivers on our school website following the links - Supporting our students- student health and safety. The documents have also been addressed by myself to all year groups as I presented on Wellbeing and Discipline to yr7-11 on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> February. Mr Meagher covers the documents for yr12 in his regular year meetings.

The aim of the Wellbeing and Discipline Policy is to provide a safe, supportive, positive and discipline teaching and learning environment. Menai is a school that focuses on care and commitment with high expectations on wellbeing and discipline a priority. To support our wellbeing and discipline processes in the school, I ask that parents acknowledged the policy that was sent to families via school bytes if you have not already done so. Your acknowledgement validates the strong work the school delivers to maintain a safe and respectful school environment. Through working together and keeping the students as the central focus in dealing with any issues, the best outcomes can be achieved.

#### Support Unit

Our support unit has commenced and been given a new name. It will be known as **the Inclusive Education Unit (IEU)**. We welcomed a Head Teacher, class teacher and two SLSOs plus 6 wonderful students to kick off this outstanding new addition to our school. 3 classrooms have been upgraded together with a new staffroom, fencing and air conditioning. To support all students, staff and community safety, an electronic security gate has also been installed at the front of the school and will be in action shortly. Once this gate is in operation, the main front gate will be closed during school hours.

#### Parent and Citizens (P&C) elected executive 2025

Thank you to the outgoing committee especially long serving members David Linquist and Andrea Brugmans for their commitment and support of MHS. #### Year 10

NAPLAN tests should not be sources of stress but should be viewed how they were intended to be; as diagnostic tests that can assist schools and parents better identify and support the learning needs of their students.

Menai High has a mantra to move HSC students up the achievement bands and the strategy is paying off. Linda Doherty reports.



Every year at the start of Year 12 Menai High School teachers measure student achievement in each HSC subject and then set a target to predict success by exam time.

Principal John Stanley explains the band prediction tracking measure: "We say to the students, 'Whatever band you're sitting in at the start of Year 12 we want to move you one band higher by HSC time'," he said.

"And it's working, along with our strong learning culture – 40 percent of our cohort this year are band 5 and 6."

The learning culture includes high expectations and trusting relationships for both students and teachers as well as consistent formative assessment and feedback.

The HSC class of 2024 is receiving additional respect from Menai High teachers as they had just entered their teenage years in Years 8 and 9 when COVID-19 severely disrupted their learning with lockdowns, learning from home, staggered starts, masks, and mass vaccinations.

"This is the cohort that went through COVID in their junior years and had a rough trot," Mr Stanley said.

"Every principal will tell you this, about how proud we are at how these students came back in Year 10 and knuckled down for their senior studies."

Menai High was back to its consistent HSC performance of pre-COVID years, with 180 students receiving 91 Band 6s and at least a dozen students with ATARs over 95.

#### First in State

Mischa Davies was first in the State in English Studies Examination, the two-unit course that focuses on honing writing and literacy skills and the fundamentals of English, with less of an emphasis on studying novels, plays, and poetry as in other English courses.

"Mischa was a diligent, focused, and friendly student who not only attended every lesson and consistently applied herself but always sought the feedback of her teachers and worked with our learning support staff to keep developing her writing," Mr Stanley said.

"Importantly, she succeeded across all her subjects with high ranks and strong results in subjects ranging from English to Visual Arts to Textiles and Design. A true product of Menai High School exit outcomes of being a skilled learner, skilled citizen and skilled for life."

Twins Lily and Kallie Thompson joined friends today at Menai High's traditional barbecue for HSC students. The twins and their parents were filmed on Wednesday by The Sydney Morning Herald as Lily logged in for her HSC results at 6am.

Lily said she studied up to four hours a day in the lead-up to the HSC exams, often with friends at local libraries.

"We also used a study tracking app to study together and create an additional motivation as well as a friendly competition," she said.

"But most of all, throughout my preparation for the HSC, I prioritised food, rest, and enjoyment, because your mental health is more important."

Isaac Warwar worked hard for his ATAR of 96 studying Advanced English, English Extension 1 and 2, Drama, Ancient History, History Extension and Standard Mathematics, with three major works to develop for the HSC. He would like to pursue a career as a writer via university study in law and communications.


